In addition we will have a special guest at this months meeting Dan Bandel, the new airport manager. Looking forward to hearing his plans for the future of the Airport!

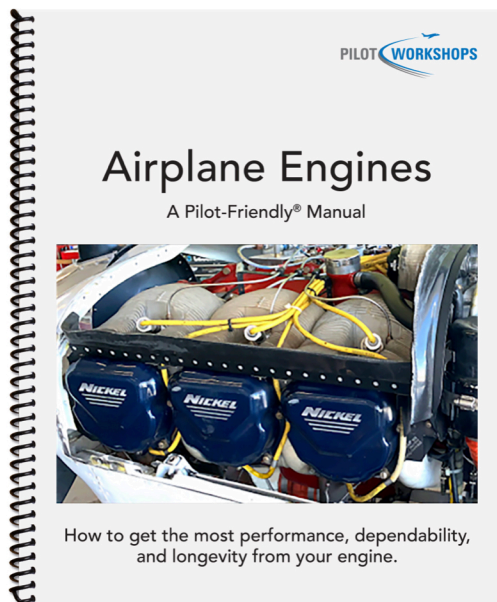

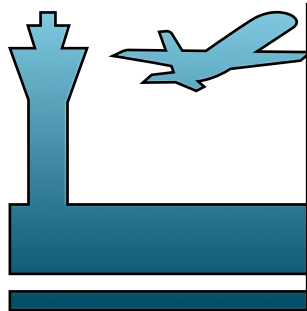
