KMWO Middletown, Ohio

Usan and I flew into KMWO in Middletown, Ohio. We used their courtesy car and drove about 35 minutes to the Museum of the United States Air Force in Dayton, Ohio. They have a big skydiving operation there. 2 prop jets carry 15 people at a time to 16,500 feet. Tandem parachuters jump from 13,000 feet. The operation runs non-stop.

They allow camping on the field and bathrooms and showers are available; plus, all the free ice that you need.

Very nice people. When we asked about camping, they offered to let me keep the car, and suggested that I put my plane in a hangar overnight. We will use this airport for future trips. ★

WACO Aircraft Corp's YMF-5F

ast Saturday I was lucky enough to catch a ride in WACO's new Amphibious YMF-5F.

This float plane is powered with a 300 hp Jacobs radial engine with a new two-bladed MT composite prop. The Aerocet floats can be removed (if you have a crane to lift the fuse and wings), but why would you do so? The plane is a ball of fun!

The plane was made light and cruises at about 110 mph. With the 300 horses we saw take off distances of about 800 feet from KBTL. Off the water, the time for takeoff was well under 30 seconds. They have really done a great job with this bird. Let's hope they sell like hotcakes! ★
