On behalf of myself and the chapter board of directors, I want to thank the membership for their vote of confidence by re-electing all of us to serve you for two more years. The one exception is that Robert Gutknecht had served his four years so we had to elect a new secretary. Richard Shepherd was elected the new secretary.

I'm very proud of the chapter for its accomplishments over the last two years. We've held three Young Eagle Rallies, a flight breakfast and aircraft display at the 2014 Thunder in the Valley Airshow, and hosted the B-17 twice. In addition, we've had our usual social events and many fly-outs. I'm especially grateful for our chapter members who are so willing to pitch in and work to make our events successful and fun.

In my column last month, I mentioned that, during the

November

meeting, we would be voting on a motion to buy a trailer to store and haul around our tables, chairs and other miscellaneous equipment. That motion passed and a maximum budget of \$7000 was allocated for its purchase. We want to buy an 8' x 16' enclosed trailer and have done some preliminary looking. We don't need the trailer right away, so we may wait until spring to purchase it, unless we find an unusual opportunity in the interim. If you happen to spot an ad or trailer for sale that meets our needs, please let a board member know about it.

Keith Kaspari, the Waterloo Airport Director and member of our chapter, talked about the status of airport construction projects, including plans for next season, and reviewed how these projects are funded. He also fielded many guestions from chapter members. The biggest concern from chapter members is the potential for eventually permanently closing runway 06/24. Since that runway is not used by air carriers, the FAA will not fund its maintenance. The approximately \$250,000 needed before long to sealcoat and paint markings will have to be provided locally. Obviously, that's a problem.

I attended the annual airport snow removal meeting on November 17th. Keith went through the extensive snow removal document with the airport maintenance crew, tower representatives and a representative from the air carrier. I knew there was a priority list for snow removal at the airport but the overall plan

The item that I found most interesting: There is no correlation between results from airport friction measuring equipment and the percent braking effectiveness that the tower quotes when Percent braking is asked. based on what pilots tell the tower. Tech Notes -A Learning Curve (Part 2) by Mike Lewis

Last month I shared a couple of detail improvements I learned from building the Diamant that I incorporated on the RV. This month I have a couple more.

"I thought it was really neat..."

One of the things I learned on the Diamant has to do with instrumentation. During the construction period, I had the opportunity to do a lot of traveling on charter flights. Naturally I sat in the right front seat. I noticed the pilot's use of an exhaust gas temperature gauge. I thought it was really neat how he would lean the engine to peak exhaust gas temperature. I thought that was so neat that I was going to include an EGT in the Diamant panel. Pretty soon after the Diamant was flying, I learned that if I leaned the old fashioned way, i.e. lean until a little roughness is detected and then richen just enough to smooth it out, I was exactly at peak EGT. The exhaust gas temperature gauge did nothing that the old method did not do. It was just extra money, weight and complexity. Obviously I did not include an EGT in the RV.

I somewhat later realized that those charter flights were in fuel injected engines. The fuel injection provides much more accurate fuel delivery to each cylinder than a carburetor does. That is why the carbureted engine gets rough when you go "over lean". Therefore the EGT does provide a very useful function on a fuel injected engine, but in my opinion it has little value on a carbureted engine.


"One other improvement I made on the RV..."


One other improvement I made on the RV has to do with supporting ignition wires, primer lines and any other lines that run along the lower side of the valve covers. On the Diamant I used an Adel Clamp to hold the ignition wires, primer lines and an oil line. These Adel Clamps were fastened to the engine cylinders with the same screws that hold the valve covers on. This was a common practice on the Wichita hardware (that's where I got the idea). The problem I discovered with that is that with the engine vibration, all of that "stuff" hanging on the rocker box screws tends to loosen those screws. Then you have a leaking rocker box. If you use that method, you will also need a spacer and a longer screw where the clamps are.

On the RV, I still use Adel Clamps (or similar homemade clamps) but fastened them to the cylinder through the baffle mount bolts, or directly to the baffles. Another advantage of this method is that I could take a rocker box cover off without disturbing the ignition harness, primer lines and vacuum gauge line.

I think you can see the difference.

I just noticed something else I used to do. I can see it on the Diamant photo, not sure where it is on the RV, but I made a little tag with common torque requirements, namely spark plugs and prop bolts, so I didn't have to go look them up at every annual.
