What is an Osprey GP-4?

It is a high performance two place side by side kit aircraft. Construction is primarily of wood and steel. At our March meeting Glen Evans announced that he has an engine and materials to start a GP-4 project. He plans to start assembling parts later this summer. Among other skills Glen has experience in the auto body repair business and this project will require a lot of filling and sanding. He said he wanted to build an airplane of wood rather than fiberglass because he felt that there would be less damage caused by ultra violet radiation; a problem he has seen from repairing Corvettes and fiberglass boats.
