
#### News From Build Committee ....



We have discovered some issues: The prop is not serviceable and won't be sold with the airplane. There needs to be some further work on the trim tab, brakes and pitot attachment schemes. However the Build Committee's recommendation to sell it as is with minimal additional capital or effort.

However now that we're moving on from the Fat Ultra, we've now cleared the build committee to get back to the Barn and Zenith build. We'll have pictures of that project next month. We've recently acquired and moved 18 foot build table from Lake Ann to the barn to support he 750 build so we're ready to get going on that project!


