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Making GA Flying More Affordable

The FAA has unveiled a new program for the use of off-the-shelf parts in type-certificated aircraft.

The new *Vintage Aircraft Replacement and Modification Article (VARMA)* program is the “next big step in keeping vintage aircraft flying,” according to officials with the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA).

VARMA uses several ex-

isting FAA policies to create a program that requires no new regula-

tions, orders, or advisory circulars, EAA officials continued.

VARMA applies to small (less than 12,500

pounds) type-certificated aircraft built before 1980. It allows ordinary maintenance personnel to validate that certain low-risk replacement parts are suitable for installation on aircraft, without the need for extensive engineering analysis or complex and time-consuming design & production approvals from the FAA.

FAA Advisory Circular 90.89c, WHAT IS IT?

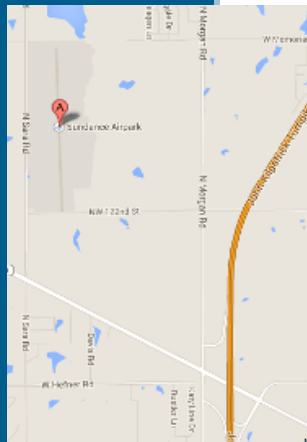
On February 14th, of this year, the FAA released advisory circular 90.89c—Amateur Built Aircraft & Ultralight Flight Testing Handbook. The intention of this circular is to provide suggestions and recommen-

dations to planning out and implementing your test flight after build or modification.

With this FAA guidance, amateur built aircraft will be able to perform task-based phase I flight testing as an alternative

to the standard 25 or 40 hour flight testing requirement. According to the Experimental Aircraft Association, the hours based test period is to be replaced with a list of tasks to complete.

9 Soldiers Killed in Black Hawk

The soldiers killed in the crash include:

- Chief Warrant Officer 2 Rusten Smith, 32, of Rolla, Mo.;
- Warrant Officer Jeffery Barnes, 33, of Milton, Fla.;
- Cpl. Emilie Marie Eve Bolanos, 23, of Austin, Texas, who was posthumously promoted to sergeant;
- Chief Warrant Officer 2 Zachary Esparza, 36, of Jackson, Mo., who was posthumously promoted to chief warrant officer 3;
- Sgt. Isaac J. Gayo, 27, of Los Angeles, Calif.;
- Staff Sgt. Joshua C. Gore, 25, of Morehead City, N.C.;
- Warrant Officer Aaron Healy, 32, of Cape Coral, Fla., who was posthumously promoted to chief warrant officer 2;
- Staff Sgt. Taylor Mitchell, 30, of Mountain Brook, Ala.;
- Sgt. David Solinas Jr, 23, of Oradell, N.J.

Two HH-60 Black Hawk helicopters that crashed and killed nine soldiers near Fort Campbell, Kentucky on March 29 collided in mid-air before going down, according to a preliminary report from the Army's aviation investigation authority released April 6. "While conducting night training in a military operations area/special use airspace, two HH-60 aircraft collided midair," the report from the Army Combat Readiness Center concluded. The Alabama-based command probes all of the service's fatal accidents, and its investigators recovered the helicopters' flight data recorders last week.

The center's officials are continuing their inquiry into the crash, according to the report. It's not yet clear whether the collision occurred due to pilot error, maintenance failures, or other potential causes.

The two medical evacuation helicopters crashed around 9:40 p.m. local time in an open field across from a residential area of Trigg County, Kentucky, the report and officials stated. The crews were practicing night missions and were wearing night-vision goggles during the exercise.

The aircraft and the fallen troops belonged to the 101st Airborne Division's combat aviation brigade.

Pilots Needed!

The FAA Civil Aerospace Medical Institute is currently conducting a Pilot Reports (PIREPs) proof-of-concept research study exploring the concepts of submitting and retrieving Pilot Reports (PIREPs) over VHF radio:

On a dedicated frequency (122.0MHz), and

Without having to talk to an ATC controller or Flight Service specialist.

The effort could pave the way

toward an additional means to submit and retrieve PIREPs. For the period of time between **November 4, 2022** and **April 30, 2023**; the FAA is looking for pilots who are **flying within** or **overflying** (e.g., in the flight levels) the areas with radius of ~ 50 nm from two airports: **Will Rogers World Airport (KOKC) in Oklahoma**, and **Nenana Municipal Airport (PANN) in Alaska**.

Volunteers are needed. Participation will be compensated.

The study is conducted on the FAA CAMI’s Cloud-based Aviation Weather Human Factors Research Platform (CbTOPS) that is available as a web and a mobile application. Pilots who are willing to volunteer with this study may go to <https://cbtopsaticami.faa.gov/> or may use the QR code.

For the first approval under VARMA, EAA used their Cessna 150 that was previously used as a testbed for its auto fuel STC. For VARMA it applied for an off-the-shelf starter solenoid as the *failure of the starter system is generally irrelevant to flight safety*. The FAA granted the first Form 337 approval under the program several weeks later. Since that time, the association also been granted approval for alternators and voltage regulators in VFR aircraft.

Initially, the FAA will be managing the program through its Chicago Aircraft Certification Office, which can be reached at 847-294-7357.

For now, approvals will be considered on an individual basis, although type clubs and ownership groups are encouraged to keep track of substitute parts that have gained approval, EAA officials advised.

Those intending to use this program must submit a request for Letter of Acceptance (LOA)

from the FAA before installing the alternative parts (VARMA Work Instruction #WI-51822, Section 8). Compliance with AC 23-27 and AC 20-62E remains relevant.

Red tape aside, this is an excellent example of FAA oversight moving aside for reasons that need no elaboration.

FAA Advisory Circular 90.89c, WHAT IS IT?

When the tasks are complete and the aircraft is shown to operate as expected, the aircraft can exit the Phase I flight testing period.

The task-based program is found in Chapter 2 of the AC, beginning on pages 2-3 (link to AC at bottom of page).

The program prescribes a series of 17 individual flight test tasks, and recommends that the tests be

flown per test cards carried in the aircraft.

The program also requires the creation of an Aircraft Operating

Handbook (AOH) from the test results, which will benefit both the builder and any subsequent owners of the aircraft, EAA officials have said.

In order to use the task-based flight testing program, the aircraft must have an operating limitation that allows the program's use, EAA officials noted. Operating limitations are issued along with the airworthiness certificate by the FAA or a Designated Airworthiness Representative (DAR) as part of the airworthiness certification process.

If you are currently in Phase I flight testing or plan to have your air-



craft inspected soon, email govt@eaa.org for details on how to obtain

the new task-based Phase I operating limitation.

The task-based flight testing program is designed to be decentralized and easy to use, according to EAA officials, who note that no follow-up reports to the Flight Standards District Offices (FSDO) or DAR are necessary after the initial inspection.

Builders are also free to use the traditional time-based Phase I program, which remains unchanged, the FAA said.

What Goes Up Must Come Down!

Did you know?

- **Approximately 450 people are killed each year in GA accidents.**
- **Loss of Control is the number one cause of these accidents.**
- **Loss of Control happens in all phases of flight. It can happen anywhere and at any time.**
- **There is one fatal accident involving LOC every four days.**

The General Aviation Joint Steering Committee (GAJSC) has determined that a significant number of general aviation fatalities could be avoided if pilots were better informed and trained in determining and flying their aircraft at the best glide speed while maneuvering to complete a forced landing.



When an engine quits — and won't restart — the next step is an emergency landing. There are three types of off-airport landings. **Precautionary landings** are made with power in anticipation of a real emergency. **Forced landings** are made with a dead engine. And a **ditching** is a forced landing in water.

The important distinction between the three is their fatality rates. The rate for precautionary landings is 0.06 percent. If you recognize a devel-

oping engine problem and can make a precautionary landing, you and your passengers will likely survive. The fatality rate for forced landings is roughly 10 percent, more than 1,600 times greater than precautionary landings. Ditchings have the worst rate, about 20 percent.

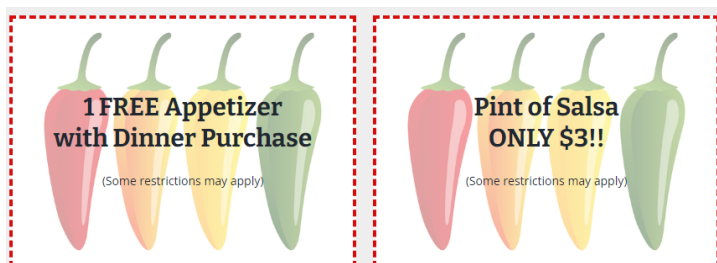

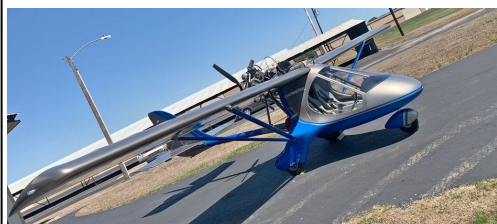
