

Member Moment

It was a few days before AirVenture. I was preparing to make the long drive but on Wednesday, a friend offered to let me ride up with and his crew. This wasn't a small general aviation plane either. This plane is the C-1A Trader, a retired Navy aircraft built in 1958, the only one still flying. While the wingspan is almost 70 feet, it folds its wings and can be tucked neatly into a T-hangar. Owned by David Huffman, it takes a whole crew to get the warbird off the ground. We departed Saturday about noon, fully expecting to be sleeping in tents at Oshkosh that night, but it was not to be. The first leg was uneventful and we landed at Moberly, MO for fuel. The plane drew quite a crowd as we poured about 300 gallons of Avgas into the tanks. We started up and taxied the whole way to the end off the runway when we got a chip light indication. The pilots immediately shut down the radial engines and we piled out. A tractor proved its strength but one of the main wheels promptly rolled into the grass and with 10K lbs, it sunk into the soft dirt. One trip to Tractor Supply and two hours later, the plane was back on the taxiway. We then towed it back to the ramp where we pulled the cowling and began inspecting the sensors. It was past 10pm by the time we took the oil filter off. The whole crew then piled into the airport van, visited Pizza Hut, and crashed at a nearby hotel.

The following morning, we inspected the filter, tested the sensors, and proved it was a false indication. We departed Moberly in the early afternoon and took the warbird ap-

proach into Oshkosh which was smooth sailing. Thank you to the Huffmans and the whole crew for a very fun, exciting trip to AirVenture!
