## Want to be an A&P? Gain experience through Homebuilding!

The FAA will soon reverse a policy that barred homebuilders from counting time spent building an aircraft toward a maintenance rating (such as an A&P certificate), according to an FAA letter of interpretation issued to Brenton Ellis, EAA 1326016, this month.

In late 2019 the FAA changed Order 8900.1 to exclude time spent building any aircraft, including homebuilts, from the types of practical experience eligible to count toward the issuance of a maintenance certificate. No reason was given for this change, and EAA has been advocating for it to be rescinded. In a meeting at AirVenture 2022 the FAA agreed

to change the policy back, however the publication of an amendment remains forthcoming.

The interpretation letter, issued on July 7, in response to a well-written and pointed request for interpretation by Ellis, confirms that not only is the current exclusionary policy not logical, it is also contrary to regulation that clearly states aircraft construction counts as experience toward maintenance ratings. The letter states that the relieving policy change is "imminent."

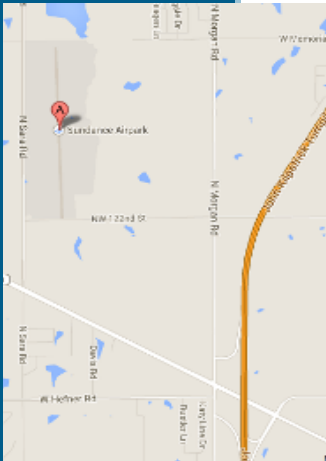
## Upcoming Chapter Meeting Information

It hasn't always been AirVenture. And it hasn't always been in Oshkosh. And it sure as heck hasn't always been this big.

The first fly-in was 70 years ago, back in September 1953, the year Paul and Audrey Poberezny founded EAA. It was at Curtiss-Wright Airport in Milwaukee. Twenty-one aircraft and 150 people showed up. They tried Oshkosh a few years later in 1956, and then moved it back to Milwaukee.

In 1959 it got too big, so they moved it to Rockford, Illinois, for 10 years and then made Oshkosh its permanent home in 1970. It was renamed EAA AirVenture Oshkosh in 1998.

Now it has grown from 21 aircraft to more than 10,000, from 150 people to more than 600,000.

**[Bell 47:](#)** One of the earliest helicopters put into production, the Bell 47, is synonymous with the Korean War and the TV show *M\*A\*S\*H*. For \$65, you can purchase a flight in a Bell 47 that will give you an aerial tour of the AirVenture grounds.

**[Ford Tri-Motor:](#)** The Roaring '20s come to life when you step inside a Ford Tri-Motor. As the first luxury airliner, the Tri-Motor played a vital role in the progression of commercial aviation in the early stages of the industry. For \$85 (\$95 for nonmembers), you can take a ride in this important piece of aviation history.

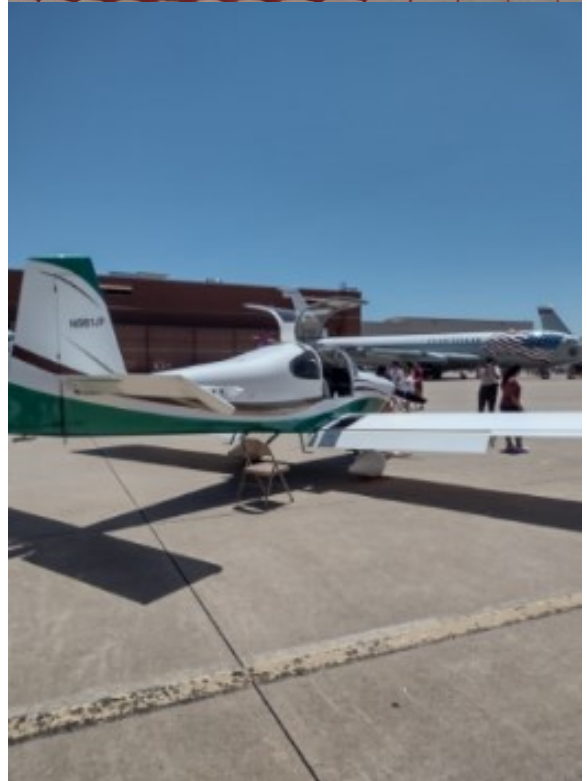
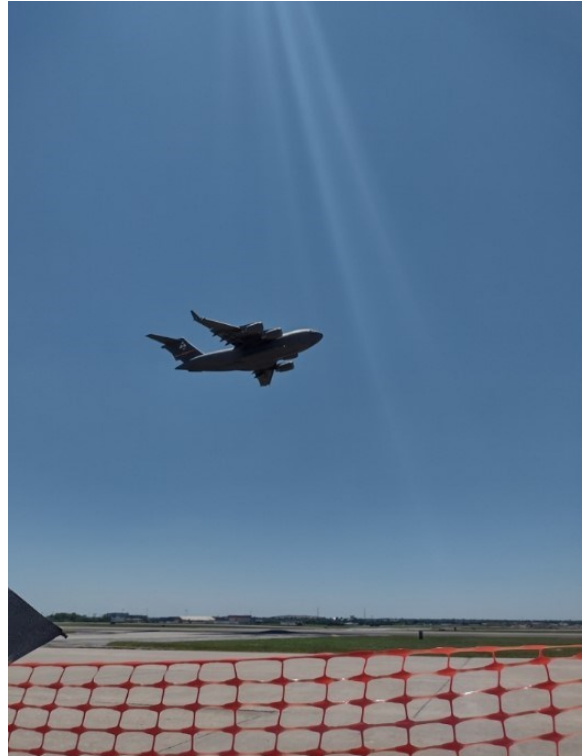
**[B-25 Mitchell:](#)** Most famous for its role in the Doolittle Raid, the B-25 was one of the stalwart medium bombers of the U.S. Army Air Forces during World War II. 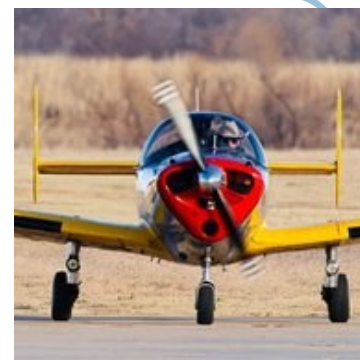

## Jets and Helicopters Highlight Modern Military at AirVenture 2023

### AIRVENTURE 2022 BY THE NUMBERS

- Attendance: 650,000, from 92 total countries
- Total Aircraft: 10,000-plus
- Total Showplanes: 3,226
- Campers: 40,000 people
- Forums, Workshops, and Presentations: 1,400-plus
- Social Media Reach: 10.6 million people

The [Air Force's Air Education and Training Command](#) will be the highlight of this year's military representation. Its current lineup of aircraft coming to Oshkosh includes F-15s, a C-17 flying hospital, a V-22 Osprey, and a C-130. These aircraft are responsible for helping develop U.S. Air Force personnel.

Air Education and Training Command is the oldest major command in the Air Force, hav-

ing been established in January 1942. AETC's training mission makes it the first command to touch the lives of nearly every Air Force member. Over the years, more than 25 million students have graduated from AETC training and education programs.

"The U.S. military has a vast array of aircraft, as every mission is unique," said Rick Larsen, EAA's vice president of communities and member programs, who coordinates AirVenture features and attractions. "That variety will be on full display at AirVenture as every branch brings something unique to the event."

# EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023 Notice Includes Important Procedure Updates

There are several important FAA-approved changes in the EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2023 Notice (commonly referred to as the Oshkosh NOTAM), featuring arrival and departure procedures for EAA's 70th fly-in convention on July 24-30 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh. These changes are based on pilot feedback and FAA review of arrival procedure recommendations.

The document is in effect from noon CDT on Thursday, July 20, until noon CDT on Monday, July 31, and outlines procedures for the many types of aircraft that fly to Oshkosh for the event, as well as aircraft that land at nearby airports. The Notice was designed by the FAA to assist pilots in their EAA AirVenture flight planning. It is now known as the Oshkosh Notice instead of a NOTAM because of a changed FAA internal procedure.

Some of the 2023 changes include:

- A change in the AirVenture ultralight pattern at Wittman Regional Airport.
- Guidance regarding Oshkosh aircraft parking areas, including North 40/South 40

designation.

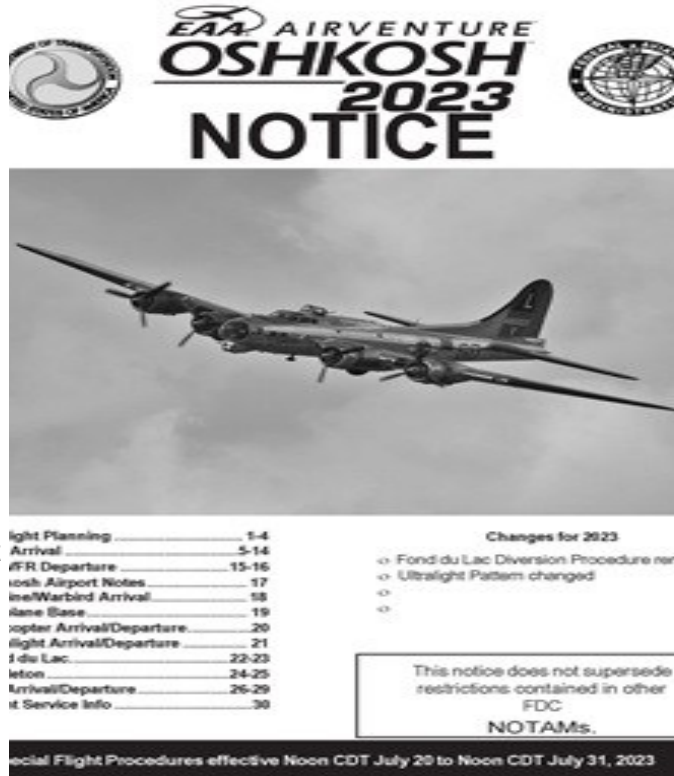
- Elimination of the Fond du Lac diversion procedure.
- The start time of the daily air shows has been changed from 2:30 to 2:15 p.m. CDT.
- The Notice and its procedures are effective

"The most essential information for any pilot flying to Oshkosh involves reading and thoroughly understanding the 2023 AirVenture Notice to ensure safe operations on arrival and departure," said Sean Elliott, EAA's vice president of advocacy and safety. "This

FAA Notice document states the official requirements and expectations for pilots. We also urge all pilots to log appropriate cross-country time prior to their trip to Oshkosh so they have the proficiency and confidence to fly safely." EAA is also hosting a webinar on June 14 at 7 p.m. regarding [flying to AirVenture 2023](#) and changes in this year's Notice. Pilots are encouraged to participate to build their knowledge prior to their flights to

Oshkosh.

through noon CDT on Monday, July 31. The ATC-assignable transition points approaching Oshkosh from the west that will ease holding and congestion will again be in effect in 2023. These points are at Endeavor Bridge, Puckaway Lake, and Green Lake. They will be announced on the arrival ATIS when ATC activates them at times of highest traffic flows.

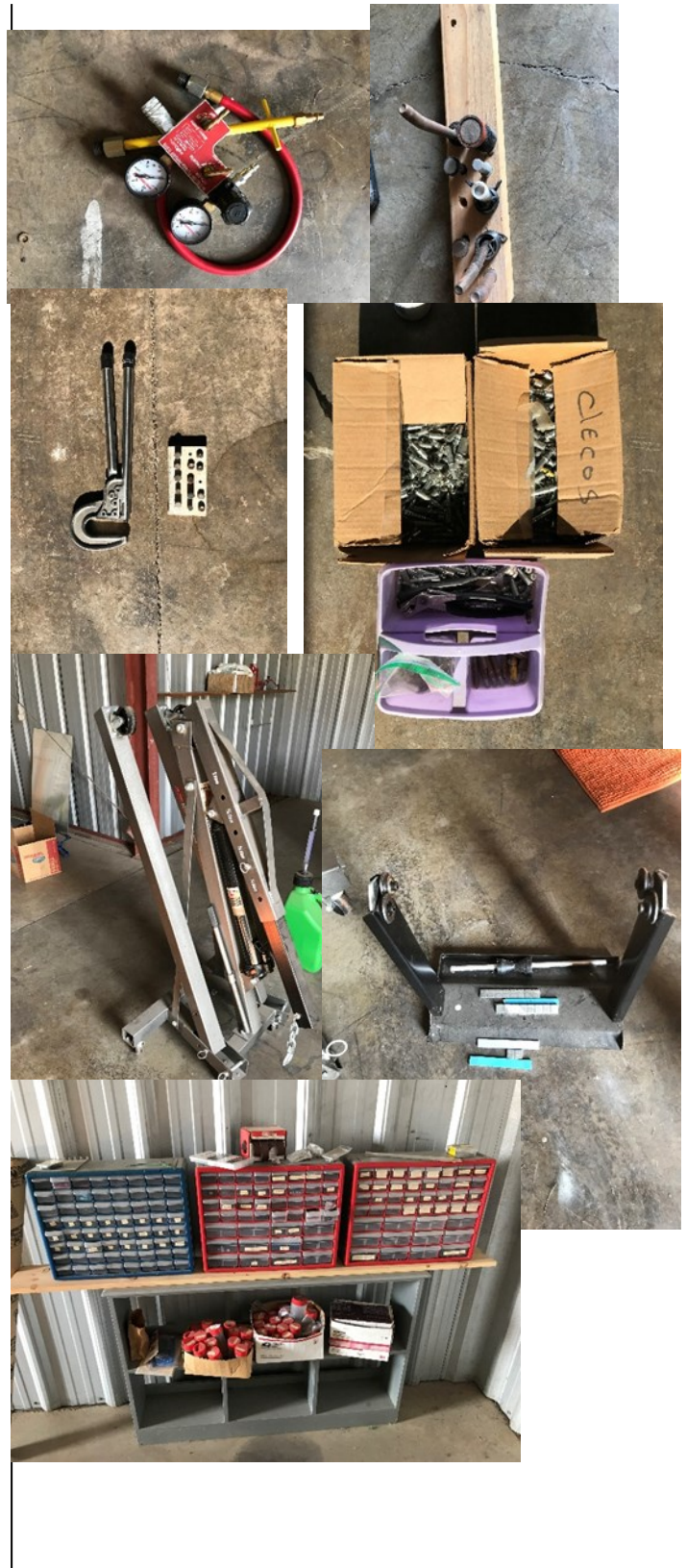
