

The plan again this year is to have classics aircraft mixed with warbirds along with WWII re-enactors, vehicles and classic cars. So I just want to make you aware of the event and let me know if any members would be interested in participating in the event. Again for this event the museum will be open both days

to view all of it's collection along with public viewing of their new storage hangar where rare aircraft are kept until they are ready to be worked on. Also we will have a BBQ at the **Rockcliffe Flying Club on** Friday night and the museum will put on a reception for all participants on Saturday evening. EXHAUST - from the Carb Heat Archives 20 YEARS AGO February 1988

The February, 1988 meeting was held at the NRC building, 100 Sussex Drive. Our chapter executive included Doug Richardson, President; Roger Fowler, Vice President; Andy Douma, Secretary; Deric Dods, Treasurer; Ted Chambers, Editor; Dave Murray, Hangars; Gary Fancy, Aircraft Operations; Gord Standing, Special Events; Rodney Stead, Membership; Dick Moore, Publisher.

Tie-downs were full with 9 aircraft parked outside and 2 in the hangar;

Blueprints for the new row hangar were stamped by the P. Eng and sent to Toronto for review; Nina and Olav Peterson, in Flight Lines, wrote about the new Porsche PFM 3200 aircraft engine flying in a Cessna 182, and composite materials being in the news.

The EAA Canadian Council was created in November 1987 to represent the 3,500 EAA members in Canada. Rem Walker, Chairman. EAA vs. EAAC was being discussed at the February meeting. Winter flying and maintenance was the subject of a workshop sponsored in January 1988 by the Continuing Education Division of the Ottawa Board of Education at the Ottawa Technical High School and Roger Fowler reported the details.

Russ Robinson was selling plans for a Davis and Mike Sacoutis had several items listed for sale. Andy Douma had Golf and T shirts with the Chapter Logo for sale too.
