## More local News

### Press Release for the Fly-in in August

The Ottawa Chapter of the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) - Chapter 245 is hosting a Fly-In/Drive-In Breakfast on Sunday August 12 at Carp Airport from 8:00 am to 11:30 am - Rain or Shine !!!

The cost of breakfast is \$5 and includes bacon, egg, toast, beans, tomatoes, coffee/tea, and orange juice.

The small amount of funds raised from this annual event will go to towards the maintenance and upkeep of the Chapter's hanger and workshop at Carp Airport. However, the breakfast is also intended to encourage public awareness of sport aviation in the Ottawa area, attract new members to the Chapter and to recreational flying and also as a meet and greet for pilots from the various airports in the surrounding area.

In previous years the Annual breakfast has attracted as many as 350 – 400 people for breakfast and as many as 50 – 60 aircraft from

local airports all across eastern Ontario and western Quebec.

This past year has seen a number of very positive developments at the Carp Airport. First, the brand new FBO/Administration Building was completed and the Carp Flying Academy (CFA) moved into the new facilities. CFA offers first-rate flight training from the introductory Recreational Flight Permit up to Commercial Pilot training as well as night and instrument flight training. Their fleet of new aircraft includes both and Cessna 172 training aircraft. You can find more information on CFA at their web site; [carpflyingacademyinc.com](http://carpflyingacademyinc.com)

The other major development at the Carp Airport was the completion of an agreement between the City of Ottawa and West Capital Develops that will see the construction of a complete residential airpark and many new commercial businesses within the airport. Construction of water and sewer services should start this
