President's Message

Things are getting more interesting at the Carp Hanger even though we have been having more rain days than normal. I hope I can see you at some of them this summer.

May Meeting Summary

At our May meeting John Phillips of West Capital Developments gave us a very entertaining talk on how and why West Capital Developments came into being to develop an air park at the Carp Airport. John showed the current plan for the development and gave a short update on the progress and the expectation that some building will be underway for Phase 1 this summer. John assured us that we will continue to have easy access to our hanger on the airport although the details of when the current access road will be closed are not yet known.

Power Outage at EAA Hanger

During the last week of May, we lost one of the three phases of our power to the hanger. After making arrangements to gain access to the old Delawri Hanger to check out the

problem with Andrew DiPippo, Bill Reed and myself, Bill Reed noticed that one of the fuses was open on the pole providing the power drop outside the RCMP hanger. Since all administrative tasks relating to the old Delawri hanger have been transferred to the RCMP, I contacted the administrator of the RCMP building who in turn referred me to the facilities coordinator who in turn contacted Hydro One to resolve the problem. Hydro One responded on the same day we notified them that a power outage had occurred and replaced a blown transformer on the pole, thus restoring the power. Wow! If only all our problems could be resolved with a couple of phone calls!

Perry Casson has made his first long distance flight in his recently completed RV-10. He flew from Regina to Ottawa in June, although he was delayed in Thunder Bay for two days due to weather. EXHAUST - from the Carb Heat Archives 20 YEARS AGO May 1988

The May 1988 meeting of EAA Chapter 245 was held at the Carp Hangar.

Thirty-eight members and fourteen guests attended. Of interest to new members, it was noted, is the various types of material used in building light homebuilt aircraft – wood, steel tube, sheet aluminum and composites.

Club representatives spoke about working with each of these

types, addressing four basic questions – why did you decide on the type of construction you chose? – how have you found working with it? – have you encountered any particular problem with this type of construction? – if starting a new project would you go this route again?.

Improvements were being made to the facilities including digging a well and locating a

water pump and pressure tank. “Now if we can only join them all together into a working pressure system” wrote President Doug Richardson. A stairwell was being built to the storage loft in the hangar and the purchasing and installation of drywall was planned for the summer of 1988.
