

## Health of the Chapter Observations:

Mark's hangar is the last taxilane, on the end / runway).

EAA Chapter 25, just by its chapter number, carries some weight in EAA history (chapters are numbered sequentially, just as EAA memberships are; you can tell how long someone's been around by their membership number). We were one of the early chapters in the organization. Our chapter's founding president, Bert Sisler, *was alive and present at our 60th anniversary!* That's some kind of history.

Paul Poberezny was great at taking the time to write letters and taking the effort to record history. He and wife Audrey filled file cabinets with correspondence and records. Whenever I read an article on EAA's history, or see old photographs of AirVentures of the past, I think of those archives and records, and their importance on our organization today. I'd gladly welcome our having a 'chapter historian' to record membership rosters every year, pictures of different planes flown by members, etc... We haven't reached our goal of 165 members. Yet. But the word is getting out. We are an outstanding chapter - I've had some newer members say that they joined Chapter 25 for the 'vibe' that we have! Chapter history and culture matter.



Some time ago I appeared before a Chapter 25 meeting and enlisted support to get the Lakeville Common Traffic Advisory Frequency (CTAF) changed to something with fewer, or no, airports sharing the CTAF frequency.

Good news, this is about to happen. Thanks to efforts on the part of the Airlake Airport Advisory Council and the MAC staff it is announced that the FAA has approved changing the Airlake CTAF frequency to 122.975 Mhz on February 20, 2025 at 0901Z.

Chapter members are encouraged to pay attention to NOTAMS implementing the change. It is possible that Lake Elmo's CTAF frequency could change in the future. Here again, paying attention to the latest charts and studying NOTAMS could make for uneventful flying.

The Young Eagles program had another fantastic year, and in some cases the program exceeded previous record numbers!

- 55,000-plus Young Eagles flown
- 4,750 Young Eagles pilots



## Hatz - Classic Jan 5, 2025 Electrical power distribution

Okay, I unearthed my old copy of The Aeroelectric Connection, by Bob Nuckolls. I found it pretty hard to read cover-to-cover, but I can usually go find the information I'm looking for in there and usually learn something else along the way.


He's worked and studied this stuff for a lifetime and has developed some innovative ideas in this arena.

An example is his recommendation for the use of fuses for most circuit protection in small, GA Acft. They're substantially cheaper, lighter and take up less space than the conventional circuit breakers. Further, if one blows inflight, you probably should just land and sort it out instead of pushing/resetting a popped circuit breaker.

Going back to the initial sketch/plan should result in a reliable and simple design. Will need to redraw the diagram to include the DPDT switch diagrammed in the right picture below. Bob Nuckolls explains this very problem/solution in his book. He has a table of different switches that can uniquely applied to most switching systems.

So, instead of two individual switches for the master and alternator field, they will be combined in a single double pole, double throw (DPDT) switch. Three positions, down will be "off", mid position "bat" and up "DC Pwr".

Later, I intend to install dual electronic ignition systems. These will require switching operations to shut down, test and operate these devices. This control can be accomplished with a DPDT switch for each ignition unit similar to this application.
