Off to a Flying Start

Sharing our passion for flight is one of the great joys of being a pilot. Despite miserable spring weather in Wisconsin, our chapter recently had the opportunity to share that passion with about 16 individuals who were interested in learning more about how to become pilots. The electricity and energy in the hangar were palpable as those participants interacted with a variety of volunteers, mentor pilots, and flight instructors.

This was a first-time event for our chapter, so we weren't quite sure how everything would go. The chosen date, Saturday, May 18, was International Learn to Fly Day and EAA was encouraging as many chapters as possible to host a Flying Start event on that date. David and I acted as event co-chairs and received the help of the chapter board and other volunteers. Materials were created by EAA that we just needed to customize for our chapter.

We asked participants to preregister so we had an idea of how many people to expect, and so we would know how many mentor pilots to recruit. Our Ray Scholar, Sonja Karner, acted as greeter to welcome the participants when they arrived. Hangar Manager Jim Kress picked up donuts and juice and made coffee and had the hangar arranged for the presentation. After some time to mill around, we started the morning with a presentation, which David Leiting led. The presentation gave an overview of EAA and the nuts and bolts of learning to fly.

It also talked about overcoming barriers to learning to fly and opened the door to some great large group discussion. How do you overcome financial barriers to learning to fly? How do you choose a flight instructor that's right for you? What do you want to do with flying? What can you do with flying? What fears do you have about learning to fly? We had plenty of mentor pilots and other chapter members in the group to have a great discussion about all of these questions and more.

Although the weather didn't cooperate for us to have the Eagle flights that morning, all of our mentor pilots came to the event. After the presentation, participants were able to talk one on one and in small groups with flight instructors















and they also met their mentor pilots. Each mentor pilot then scheduled an individual time for an Eagle flight on a later date. Serena Kamps and Gary Geisler taxied aircraft over to the hangar so that participants and pilots could go outside and look at the aircraft and continue their conversations.

We also provided lunch for everyone, with Tracy Noack and Dennis Moehn taking on the job of grilling and organizing the food. It was a great way to have people continue their conversations and to thank everyone for their attendance.

This event was successful because of the efforts of our members. The energy in the hangar when all of the conversations were taking place was amazing. Just having the presentation and information alone would not have been nearly as powerful.

The fact that everyone could have time to process that information, and then speak individually with a variety of people, made it much more powerful.

In addition to attending our event, all participants were given a complimentary chapter membership through the end of the year. The board hopes that this will provide additional support to them to help them pursue their dreams of flight. I'm excited to see these new members at upcoming meetings and for the rest of you to meet them as well. Hopefully Flying Start will become an annual event for our chapter.



Fourth Tuesday of the Month 7:00 pm Location: Chapter Hangar Local AMA Chapter is mentorship. It is why the Ray Aviation Scholarship is so important. It is why we held a Flying Start Event. It is also why being part of a chapter can be so powerful. Mentorship is the key to success in anything, really, and aviation is no different. Apparently only about 20% of people who start their private pilot training finish through their check ride. The Ray Aviation Scholarship is hoping to turn that statistic on its head with a goal of 80% completion for its scholars. At our Flying Start event, participants were able to get a whole lot of information in one place, but they were also able to connect with real people who have been in their shoes.

I think about who my aviation mentors are and what an important role they played in my life – as an aviator and as a person. My flight instructor told me after I passed my private pilot check ride that he is my "instructor for life." He encouraged me to contact him any time I have questions, and I do. If I have questions about an airspace I haven't gone into in a while, or procedures I have questions

about, I know that he's an email or a phone call away. I enjoy flying with my husband and daughter — both of whom are more experienced pilots than I am. At the same time, we do a lot of debriefing situations after flights; what went well, what didn't. We challenge and support each other.

I'm beginning to feel like I am in a position to be a mentor to others. It was fun to be able to answer questions and encourage all of the prospective pilots in the hangar at Flying Start. The reason that I've become active in our chapter is that I want to be able to give the support to others that has been given to me. I know that I still have a lot to learn when it comes to flying, and I'm so happy that I have many people in my life that I can turn to who will help me grow. Mentorship isn't only in one direction – I love that flying challenges me to keep learning and keep growing. I hope to become a better mentor to others, but I don't foresee outgrowing the need for mentorship from others either.
