From Our Scholar, Sonja

I have exciting news!

First, on October 17, I successfully completed my first solo! I'm struggling to explain the feeling I experienced when I got onto 36 and saw the runway sitting in front of me; freedom and excitement don't do it justice. As soon as I opened the throttle, I focused back in and completed the flight. I felt relaxed, but still focused, throughout the whole flight. On each final, I reminded myself of the comments my instructor routinely makes to me and was pleased with how smooth each landing was. Since this flight, I soloed once more on a 'sightseeing' flight to the West, to get comfortable and thinking by myself outside of the pattern.

Since my solo, we have been planning cross countries and should be flying these this coming week. We have been reviewing the maneuvers I will need to execute during my checkride. I learned these prior to my solo but needed a refresher on some after flying in the pattern for a couple weeks. I was also introduced to short and soft field takeoffs and landings this month. On October 24, I had my first night flight. We flew to Appleton for three landings and then returned to Oshkosh to practice with different lighting situations. I have never been in the air at night and was amazed by the views but also understood how dangerous emergencies can be, as unlit populated

areas look the same as unlit non-populated areas.

Also on October 24, I successfully passed my written exam! I took the exam in the afternoon at the Fox Valley Technical College-S.J. Spanbauer Aviation & Industrial Center in Oshkosh. I was honestly more nervous for this exam than I was for my first solo flight, but I knew I had studied as much as possible and was fully prepared to pass the exam. As I progressed through the test, I gained more and more confidence in myself but still forced myself to slow down and think through each question to avoid silly mistakes. Although I was confident in my answers, I was extremely relieved when I saw the screen display "Pass". Since completing this exam, I have focused my studies on the oral exam and preparing to take that in the coming month.

In review, October has been a highlight month for me. I logged a total of 11.4 flight hours, including 1.1 night hours and 1.1 solo hours, and I completed 65 landings. This means I have a total of 34.8 flight hours and 183 landings, since I started training in June.

I am extremely grateful for all of your support and remind myself of this each time I'm preflighting. Thank you!

I wish you the best in November and look forward to our next gathering!




Upcoming Fly-Outs!
