

### Chapter Member Jim Casper Recognized by EAA

#### Jim Casper has led volunteer efforts at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh for four decades

EAA AVIATION CENTER, OSHKOSH, Wisconsin — (November 13, 2023) — Jim Casper of Oshkosh, Wisconsin, was recognized on November 9 for his contributions and volunteer service to the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA), as he received the Henry Kimberly Spirit of Leadership Award during the EAA Halls of Fame banquet at the EAA Aviation Center in Oshkosh.

The award is named for the late Henry Kimberly, a longtime Oshkosh civic leader who was instrumental in building community support for EAA when the fly-in arrived in Oshkosh in 1970, and later in the move of EAA headquarters to Oshkosh in the early 1980s.

Casper was recognized for more than four decades of service as an EAA AirVenture Oshkosh volunteer and chairperson at the North 40 Flight Line Operations at Wittman Regional Airport. That area welcomes thousands of aircraft each year, whose owners and passengers camp next to their aircraft for the weeklong fly-in. North 40 volunteers coordinate the thousands of landing aircraft and safely move them into parking and camping areas, as well as synchronizing their departures from Oshkosh when they return home.

Casper also has been involved in many other EAA activities, including at the EAA Aviation Museum and at the museum's Pioneer Airport. In addition, he is actively involved in EAA Chapter 252 based in Oshkosh, including as the chapter's past president and with a current re-creation project of Steve Wittman's famed "Buster" racing airplane.

"Jim represents the best of EAA volunteer corps – knowledgeable, dedicated, and a mentor to new volunteers," said Jack Pelton, EAA's CEO



and chairman of the board, who presented the award at a dinner in the EAA Aviation Museum's Eagle Hangar. "He has been an outstanding example of our volunteers from the Oshkosh area who make EAA a destination for aviation enthusiasts from all parts of the globe."

Along with announcing the Henry Kimberly Award that recognizes Oshkosh-area volunteers, the November 9 program inducted five aviators into the EAA Halls of Fame. They included aviation enthusiasts from diverse aircraft areas that encompass homebuilt, vintage, warbird, ultralight, and aerobatic aircraft.
