

with a dark room in our basement. You had to be a member or have some kind of credentials to get behind the fence in those days, at least that's how I recall it. Dad had a customer who was able to get press credentials for my brother and so our family attended. My brother was thrilled and took a bunch of photos which he then developed in the basement dark room and submitted to our local paper. I remember being amazed at the aircraft and the airshow, and my dad talking to me about the planes. Little did I know at that time the place aviation would hold in my life in the future.

My next time attending wouldn't be until 1995. My husband attended on his own in 1994 and came home ready to get his pilot's license and started training almost immediately, fulfilling a dream he'd had since childhood. In 1995, we went as a family with our young children. We haven't missed a year since.

The scope of AirVenture is difficult to comprehend. As we know, it is so much more than an air show. Many describe it as a giant family reunion, and I agree. It is airshow, trade show, educational conference, networking opportunity, and family reunion all rolled into one.

I'm reminded of how I sometimes take this annual trek to AirVenture for granted when I meet people from other places who have always wanted to attend but haven't had the chance. We often wear "Oshkosh" t-shirts when we're traveling, especially when visiting museums in other parts of the country. It often has resulted in strangers approaching us and ask-

ing if we've "been to Oshkosh." When tell them we live nearby and start talking about the convention, they get almost wistful. They share stories of the times they've attended or their desire to attend "some day."

I've met so many great people over the years that I've attended AirVenture, particularly in recent years as I've become more active in our chapter. I also love the ways that the convention itself grows and changes each year — expanding opportunities (and also basic amenities like bathrooms and food choices). Each year there are so many new things to look forward to.

One of the things I've learned to do is to talk to more people. Air-Venture is the perfect place to talk to strangers, I've learned. One of the best places to do that is when grabbing a bite to eat. Often the tables are crowded, so it becomes necessary to join an occupied table. John and I have learned to strike up a conversation (which is challenging for the naturally introverted) and have met some really great people that way. I highly recommend it.

A few years ago, I was getting ready for my private pilot written and my check ride. I had been dragging my feet on taking the written test and was going to schedule it for right after convention. John had been prodding me to just get it done, so he challenged me that if I didn't take the test prior to convention he would make a shirt that said, "I'm studying for my private pilot written, ask me a question" and make me wear it on the grounds. That was enough to spur me to take the test

prior to convention.

I'm looking forward to a lot of things for convention this year, but one of the highlights will definitely be the people. I hope I see a lot of you there!
