

If you want to fly Young Eagles, you just can't "show up" that morning and say, "I want to fly". You must pre-register to fly Young Eagles.

Also, if you intend to fly Young Eagles or be a ramp escort bringing Young Eagles out to the planes, you must have completed EAA's Youth Protection Policy and Program. This is a short on-line course offered by EAA. This verification is valid for three years from the date of completion. The link is below:


