




Dave <u>Vancina</u> gave an opening prayer for the evening.


MORE RE-CAP OF THE CHRISTMAS PARTY




FRED BOOS FIRST EAA 260 CHAPTER PRESIDENT

JOE'S CIRELLI'S RV PROJECT UPDATE:

Things got complicated at the end of November... Van's declared Chapter 11 bankruptcy, which allows them time to reorganize. They have replaced the C-suite with an interim team and have engaged a team of consultants who specialize in turning around companies in financial trouble. While the future of Vans is still uncertain, it is likely product sales and support will continue (they are still selling, shipping and supporting their products at this time).

Fortunately (for me, at least) I had already received the fuselage kit in September. There are very few laser cut parts in the fuselage kit. I've finished the tail cone, and the empennage is now complete and in storage. I'm beginning work on the forward fuselage, which will take a year or two. By then, I'm confident that there will be a path moving forward with Van's. If not, I'll have a heck of a yard decoration.
