
I am now working on my complex/high performance endorsements with <u>Dan Simanaitis</u> and plan to start Commercial soon afterwards.

- Aerodynamics effect with ice.



#### THE BUILDER'S CORNER

#### JOE'S CIRELLI'S RV 14A PROJECT UPDATE

The firewall section and the lower structure of the forward fuselage of the RV14 is finally complete, and we're beginning to work on the middle fuselage side section. I anticipate this section being complete around Memorial Day (if all goes well). Once this section is complete, it will look more like an airplane; and shortly after, the tail section will be attached. I've enjoyed working on the fuselage kit, probably more so than the wing kit. There are few repetitive tasks; I am learning or building something new with each section – and that keeps me on my toes.



#### **AEROLITE 103**

This little airplane is being built at Bult field (C56) by one of our Chapter260 Members, <u>Mark Kirchman</u>. As its name implies, it will be flown under the Part 103 rules for Ultralights. It easily meets all the Part 103 rules. The unique thing about this one is that it will be electric powered.

I can't wait to see this colorful little plane flying at Bult. It will be the first electric plane that I'm aware of in our area. It will not be making much noise. The Aerolite company claims it can fly for up to 1 hour on a full charge with 4 -72 volt batteries. It will be slow with a conservative throttle setting to fly at 45 mph.

It can go faster, but will cut into the hour of endurance. I'm betting the smiles will be from flying and watching this unique little plane. Mark's hangar, C10 is across from me and Frank. 


