



Gayle Wilts and Tom Rademacher are building airplanes!

Tom and Carol Rademacher moved to Sioux Falls about 11 years ago from the Sioux City area. As a pilot, I decided to come out to Y14 see what was happening at Lincoln County Airport. I have had a hangar here since then.

Q: What made you decided to start building airplanes?

Tom: I was always interested in building airplanes and soon a friendship was developed with Gayle Wilts - a premier builder in the area. I was so interested, that I decided with Gayle's help to start building airplanes.

Q. What is your relationship with Gayle in building projects?

Tom: Gayle is a good friend, mentor, and advisor. Gayle helps me with quality control with each project and builds certain parts of the plane.

Q: What type of builder do you consider yourself?

Tom: We are building Experimental Aircraft kits—VANs and RANs kits. There are three Rans S21 airplanes in the works. When the Van's RV15 is introduced, I am sure we will build that plane. Airplane frames and structures are built in Tom's hanger. Engine install, electronic install (radios etc) and painting/wrapping are done by specialists.

Q: What happens after each project is completed?

Tom: We will fly the airplane 40-60 hours to make sure everything is working as designed and then marketing the plane after that.

Q: Do you help other builders with their projects?

Tom: Gayle and I will assist a builder with their project here at my hangar.

The FAA has the Builder Assist program that allows us to provide some labor, tools, location and experience to make the building process easier and safer.

Q: Anything else?

Tom: Building an airplane is challenging and fun. I have certainly gotten out of my comfort zone. There are very few locations that have the people with the skill, help and knowledge that Y14 has to offer.


The 75th anniversary of the U.S. Air Force will be one of the highlights of EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2022, the 69th edition of EAA's annual fly-in convention coming July 25-31 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh.

The U.S. Air Force was created on September 18, 1947, as part of the National Security Act, which established a separate military air branch and put all military branches under a new Department of Defense. It recognized the importance of military air operations and separated it from the former Army Air Forces while naval aviation operations remained separate.

U.S. military air operations date back to the Civil War, when balloons were first used as reconnaissance platforms. In the early 1900s, the Army's Signal Corps was tasked with "all matters pertaining to military ballooning, air machines and all kindred subjects." The first aero squadron, as it was then known, became active in 1913 and saw its first combat duty in 1916.

Today, the Air Force has more than 325,000 personnel and more than 5,000 aircraft. The Air Force also has incorporated an increasing number of unmanned aerial systems as part of its inventory, and continues development of new aerial technology to meet current operational demands.

The four RV-3 Vanguard Squadron planes (Picture One above) were built in 1980's by Gayle Wilts. Ed Ludtke and Dick Pearson each built one plane for total of six at one time. No major modifications other than engine overhaul has been needed throughout the years. Paint scheme has changed from the yellow to black and blue.

Vanguard Squadron is using four planes today. Vanguard Squadron was featured display at Air Venture in 1994 (Pictures Three & Four). Vanguard Squadron was August 1994 featured month (Pictures One & Two) in EAA 1994 World of Flight-Official Calendar.

The Vanguard Squadron has been ethanol powered since the team began flying together in 1993. Ethanol adds power and performance to the Squadron's aircraft without any major engine modifications. The team has over 3,000 flight hours using 100% ethanol.
