Ellie has more than 10 hours now and is training right here at 4B9!


Karl told us a cautionary tale about making sure your paperwork is correct when doing maintenance!

Pancake Breakfasts in the Future for 4B9


Thank you to our chapter president, Vince, for sharing this writeup of a recent trip that he and Doug took to Northampton, MA:
