From The Desk of the President



We are through the Christmas and New Year Holiday period and already nearly half way through January. I had booked \$69 tickets on the inaugural flight of Avelo to Orlando, hoping to fish at Lake Okeechobee in Florida with my family. Unfortunately, TSA concerns blocked the first flights out

of Dubuque and we had to abort that trip. Due to upsizing the planes out of Dubuque from less than 60 to nearly 180 seats, a different set of rules apply.

I understand those of us with airfield access will need to get photo ID and a background check once the TSA approves our airport security plan. There may be some changes to our EAA hanger security plan as well. We are waiting to see. Hopefully it won't be prohibitively expensive. Our Airport Manager will let us know when security training is available & how to get our ID badges.

There was a record turnout at the EAA hanger for Saturday morning coffee last week. I tried sending out a "Chapter Blast" from EAA HQ. They sent an email to every national EAA member within 50 miles informing them about our coffee. I expected a few people to show up. Much to our surprise, attendance jumped from the normal ten members to twenty-five, including folks from Freeport and Davenport. Thank you, Chapter members, for engaging the newcomers in conversation. We have a few new members, and offered Young Eagle rides to two youth interested in becoming pilots.

It was a pleasure to attend the Chapter IMC Club last night. It is the second Thursday of the month, 7pm, in the EAA Hanger. Mike Nickeson, CFII (instrument instructor pilot), is our normal speaker. He selected a short quiz on weather topics, and a video on an instrument flight in Texas on top of clouds in winter necessitating a descent through clouds at freezing temperatures. About twelve members came and enjoyed the conversation with other instrument pilots about decision making and

risk mitigation involving potential ice.

Your Board of Directors met with our Airport Manager, Todd Dalsing, early this month to discuss his plans for the year and how our Chapter might participate. He reviewed what is on the calendar, and is very pleased to see the hangers filled and our encouragement of general aviation. The utility bills for the hanger are exceeding hanger rent by \$163/mo. Todd said he would like to be revenue neutral and we should expect an increase in rent when the lease renews the end of September. Your Board will discuss how to cover this. Current revenue is from dues, hanger rent and pancake breakfast receipts.

The new G-1000 simulator is operational and we have had several donors step up, some in smaller amounts, and one very generous one, to cover the purchase price. Bridger, Kevin and Brett are working on procedures to make it sustainable and cover the costs of maintaining and eventual replacement. More details to follow.

Our program for this month is local pilot Eric. He flies for McCoy Group and manages corporate aircraft maintenance and scheduling. He'll speak about how he grew into his job and what it entails as well as answer questions. The social meal ahead of the meeting will be provided by Linda and Joe Weber, who always put out an amazing spread. Come and enjoy with us at 6:30pm next Tuesday, January 17.

EAA Volunteer Pilots

- Current EAA member
- Youth protection and background check
- Legal to carry passengers
 - Currency requirements
 - Flight review
- Medical/Basic Med (if applicable)
- · Airworthy aircraft
- Passenger liability insurance
 - Pilot must carry a minimum of \$100,000 per passenger liability insurance
- Supplemental EAA insurance (\$1M)

Before the Flight

- Complete registration form and waiver
 - · Signature from parent/legal guardian and pilot
- · Leave the waiver on the ground
- . No hot loading (boarding with the engine(s) running)
 - Helicopters included
- Provide passenger briefing (suggested)
 - How to board the aircraft
 - · How the seatbelts work
 - · How the doors/canopy work
