Ray Scholar Update

From Virtual to Reality



My name is Addy Scardino, and I am currently the Ray Scholar. My journey into aviation began in an unexpected place—at home, flying a simulator. Armed with a computer monitor, rudder pedals, and a yoke, I completed 23 lessons as part of a private pilot course in my basement. Chuck Weber was the person who introduced me to this world of flight, providing me with all the resources I still use today. He mentioned the simulator as a tool that could make flight training easier, suggesting that the skills learned on the computer would directly transfer to flying an actual plane. At the time, I was skeptical. It was hard to imagine how something so virtual could help in such a real-world skill.

Despite my initial doubts, I persevered and completed all the lessons, dedicating about four months to getting a score I felt good about on each one. By October, I was ready to begin my private pilot training, though I was both excited and nervous as I pulled up to the Key Cities hanger. This was it—my first time flying a real


airplane. My instructor, Cody, guided me through the preflight process and showed me the basics on the ground, including how to fuel the plane (which proved to be a challenge at least for me).

Once we took off, I immediately started analyzing the plane's controls. To my surprise, they felt familiar. The lessons and notes I had taken during my simulator training were directly relevant to what I was seeing and feeling in the cockpit. As we started practicing maneuvers—turns, stalls, slow flight—it became clear to me that I had already encountered these exact lessons in my basement. That moment of realization was a turning point; the nerves started to fade, and a sense of calm washed over me. I wasn't entering this experience completely blind. In fact, I

already had a solid foundation.

Now, three months into my private pilot training, I've never been more confident about my path. The thrill and excitement of flying is unlike anything I've ever experienced. Every time I leave the ground, my passion only grows stronger. I constantly strive to improve, learn more, and achieve greater things.

Looking back, I can confidently say that the simulator played a pivotal role in building my confidence and preparing me for the real thing. I wouldn't change a single part of my training or the people who have supported me along the way.






ZENITH 750 CRUZER
