EAA 327—LED Chicago Sectional Project


We will be building an interactive L.E.D. Chicago sectional chart for display on the hangar wall. Member Doug DuPlessis recently built a smaller version for his home office and brought it out for a show and tell session last Saturday.

It displays ceiling conditions (vfr, mvfr, ifr, lifr) and wind conditions at all the airports on the entire Chicago sectional. It is a detailed project that will require input and talent from a few of our members to complete in a 1 day build. The build date is set for Saturday April 9th starting at 0930, so come out and lend a hand or observe.

Once this project is completed, we have the information about what products are required, where to purchase, and plan on offering a second session for any individual(s) that want to build a smaller one for their home/office/hangar etc.

That build will take place in May with an official date to be determined.

Cost will be about \$250 including frame & materials. Contributions welcome. A check or cash to our Treasurer Brett Pearce marked "LED display" would be grand.

Aviation Summer Camp opportunity

Do you know anyone who would be interested in an aviation oriented youth summer camp for boys or girls? EAA runs a highly regarded Air Academy Camp at the Air Venture campus in Oshkosh. The national magazine MSN Money described the camp as one of 10 camps being "worth it". Every summer they are over subscribed and there is a wait list. It came to my attention that Chapter 75 in the Quad Cities has been sending young people to camp for many years.

Our Chapter Board was able to reserve some spots for this summer. Young Eagles Camp for ages 12-13 June 20-24 is \$960. We have reserved one spot at the Basic Camp for ages 14 & 15 from July 5-10 costing \$1,280 and another for Advanced Camp ages 16-18 July 28-Aug 8 costing \$1,805. Our chapter paid the \$200 deposit/ reservation fee for each camp. Reservations are first-come, first-serve and payment must be made 30 days before the camp.

I personally stayed in the Air Academy Lodge for the Chapter Leader Academy. It is a modern building with four bunks to a room and showers down the hall. Food was great and plentiful. It is something I would have enjoyed at that time of my life. There are also openings for camp staff & counselors. Please give it some thought. If there is sufficient interest, our Chapter may make it an ongoing program.


