From The Desk of the President



I just returned from the wake Wally Brown, Past President of Chapter 327, wife Barbara's memorial. She recently passed from complications of Lupus Erythematosis, a skin and systemic autoimmune disease. Wally came to our Chapter about 10-15 years ago and offered to be President

when no one else would take the job. He had a vision for a growing, vibrant organization and made a difference for EAA. Barbara encouraged him to get involved and she was right there at his side. Wally ran the UD for Kids program for many years and is responsible for getting several of the pilots on our field interested in aviation. They were a great couple, and contributed a great deal to EAA and to our community. Wally had a kidney transplant several years ago and is at the Hawkeye Rehab Center trying to get strong and independent enough to be discharged and go home. He welcomes visitors.

Merle Neises called and told me he recently visited the EAA observation area off the drive to the new terminal. EAA members financed and built the structure that was originally on the site of the University of Dubuque's new academic flight center. It was moved to the current place, and our Chapter cleans, repairs and paints the structure and picnic tables each year. There is a radio repeater that broadcasts ATC radio communications and a pair of handicap accessible binoculars to look at the planes through. Our Ray Scholar, Bridger Hawkinson, recently did his Eagle Project there installing signage regarding the airport. It is a fun place to take a small group of twenty or less for a picnic and watching airplanes. There are several clean, varnished picnic tables on site. Some visitors look for airplane tail numbers through the binoculars, enter them in Google search, and get the type of plane, where it is from and where it's going, and listen to the air traffic radio instructions as a way to pass some fun times. If you haven't been up there, please visit and let friends know. It is handicap accessible and family friendly. When it comes time to clean and paint this spring, please volunteer to help out.

Our Chapter was recently awarded an \$11,000 pilot training scholarship through EAA and the Ray Foundation. We have selected four candidates over the last three years, Joe Chapman, Bridger Hawkinson, Andrew Barbee and Austin Haubenstricker and so far have a 100% completion rate. The local CAP Squadron has been helping us with Young Eagles and other airport activities and is run by several of our members. They have two candidates for consideration, and we will be interviewing them soon.

Some of our members that work at John Deere have found they can be compensated for volunteer hours and the money directed toward our EAA Chapter non-profit organization. I encourage those who direct charitable dollars to our local non-profit to be active in directing how the money will be spent. Flight scholarships are going to be awarded this year to finance Cadet training in the CAP plane. Instructors at UD donate their time to teach and the planes are available at reduced rate for training. Anyone who wishes to donate through their workplace volunteer programs is encouraged to participate. Another way to donate is to give cash gifts or all or part of mandatory RMD funds from an IRA. Please inquire of Treasurer Brett or President Chuck if interested.

TSA approved the security program at the Dubuque Airport to submit background checks for flight line badges. If you are in EAA and have a reason to be on the flight line (pilots or volunteering), please take the training at the Jet Center and get an ID badge. As the program is implemented, we'll need new locks for the doors with individual codes for each member to get access into our building.

I'm looking forward to warmer, more pleasant weather in the next month or two. Our regular meeting will be the third Tuesday of the month, March 21st. Social time and a light dinner will be at 6:30pm with the meeting at 7. We'll watch the EAA Chapter Video to see what is going on at national Oshkosh headquarters, and some videos of aviation interest. Hope to see you there.

EAA Announces Inaugural Learn to Fly Week – May 15 to 20

Aspiring aviators will have the opportunity to discover multiple pathways to becoming a pilot as EAA presents its inaugural Learn to Fly Week on May 15-20.



Beginning May 15th, expert flight instructors and representatives from various aviation organizations will present free, interactive webinars. These webinars will cover topics from starting flight training, saving time and money in flight training, preparing for the FAA written exam, to passing the checkride, and so much more. While the live showing of these presentations will be open to the public, the recordings will be archived for EAA members to view at their convenience.

Learn to Fly Week will conclude on Saturday, May 20, with Flying Start events hosted at chapters across the country. EAA's Flying Start program allows EAA chapters to welcome, encourage, and educate new aviation enthusiasts about the fun, freedom, and accessi-

bility of personal aviation in their local area. Following a short presentation about learning to fly, attendees will be offered a free introductory Eagle Flight to experience the spirit of aviation firsthand.

"Becoming a pilot is a dream for many, but few know where to start their journey. Learn to Fly Week was created to help encourage aspiring pilots to take action and begin the pilot training process," said David Leiting, EAA Eagles Program Manager. "Our goal is to show attendees how accessible achieving their dream actually is." Leiting also added that inspiration from this event stemmed from packed forums at the Learn to Fly Center at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2022, as well as the success of other EAA virtual events like Homebuilders Week and Virtual Ultralight Days.



Combining the educational forums from the Learn to Fly Center and the connections and inspiration found at Flying Start events, EAA Learn to Fly Week is the latest effort in the ongoing effort to help aspiring pilots achieve their dream of flight.

EAA Volunteer Pilots

- Current EAA member
- Youth protection and background check
- Legal to carry passengers
 - Currency requirements
 - Flight review
 - Medical/Basic Med (if applicable)
- · Airworthy aircraft
- Passenger liability insurance
 - Pilot must carry a minimum of \$100,000 per passenger liability insurance
- Supplemental EAA insurance (\$1M)

Before the Flight

- Complete registration form and waiver
 - · Signature from parent/legal guardian and pilot
- Leave the waiver on the ground
- . No hot loading (boarding with the engine(s) running)
 - Helicopters included
- Provide passenger briefing (suggested)
 - How to board the aircraft
 - · How the seatbelts work
 - How the doors/canopy work
