Ray Aviation Scholarship Eligibility Requirements:

- Age 16-19 for powered flight training (15-19 for glider pilot license)*
- Possession of a student pilot certificate
- Possession of FAA medical certificate (Private Pilot- Airplane students) (Glider Pilot students* need no medical but must not have medical conditions preventing safe completion of flight; Light Sport students must have FAA medical certificate or Drivers license- some restrictions apply) (SEE 14 CFR § 61.23 Medical certificates:)
- Be able to begin their flight training within 60 days of receiving the award
- Commit to two hours (or more) of Chapter activities per month, such as:
 - Volunteer at Young Eagles rallies
 - Volunteer at Chapter pancake breakfast / lunch fly-ins
 - Chapter build project support
 - o Chapter gathering participation
 - o Chapter social media and website maintenance
 - Chapter newsletter articles
- Submit monthly progress reports
- Commit to reaching designated flight training milestones, as outlined by EAA's training timeline
- Submit Completed Application within deadline listed on the application.
