CAJUN SHRIMP PASTA SALAD

C'est Si Bon

Here is a recipe that looks good but just might not appeal to kids ---since it was created by a Cajun lady with a heavy hand for Tony Chachere's Original Creole Seasoning. She is my sister, Nora, a Cajun descendent of our Mother Luby Latour, and Grandmother Edez Breaux. They cooked their way to stardom in Cajun Country and passed it on to my wife Gail.

Cajun Shrimp Pasta Salad

Ingredients:

- 3 pounds colored cork screw noodles.
- 3 pounds popcorn shrimp, frozen ready cooked
- 3 medium size yellow bell peppers, diced
- 2 pounds green grapes, each grape sliced in half
- 3 ounces small black olives, each olive sliced into four parts
- 1 celery double hearts, diced
- 12 juvenile free range small brown eggs
- 3 bacon strips
- Real Mayonnaise
- Zesty Italian Dressing
- Salt, as required
- Pepper, as required

Standard Disclaimer:

Just like a masterpiece, the Cajun Shrimp Pasta Salad Recipe (for 40 P.E.) will never be finished. Most Cajuns do not have a recipe for it. But I can tell you how Gail & I made it.

Directions:

Cook and drain colored cork screw noodles.

While pasta cooks, stem & clean seeds from peppers & dice them

Mix celery, bell pepper, black olives and grapes in bowl.

Crumble bacon strip.

Add tomatoes, cucumbers, carrots and avocados if you have them.

Dice white of boiled eggs.

Add yolk with 2 tablespoons of Real Mayonnaise and a lot of Zesty Italian Dressing.

Mix into a cream solution. Add more Mayonnaise for your taste.

Mix everything together & let set for 1 to 3 days in a chilled atmosphere.

Side Dish

Tomatoes, 12 each, cut into 5 to 6 slices

Hickory Oak Sliced Ham, 7 pounds

Bread, Whole Wheat, 4 loaves

Mayonnaise
