Shortest Runways at Commercial Airports

Not all runways are built the same. Some are relatively short, while others are remarkably long. Some are as narrow as 40 feet wide, while the widest are 200 feet across. Runways can be built out of asphalt, concrete, dirt, or even on riverbeds in the backwoods. The shortest runways are exclusively used for general aviation, but this article will tell you the shortest ones used for US airline operations.

John Wayne Orange County is the shortest commercial runway in the US. It's 32 miles southeast of LAX. The runway is 5,700 feet. A lot of locals use it to avoid LAX.

Hilton Head Island Airport on the southern coast of South Carolina is the smallest runway. It's 5,000 feet long and only 100 feet wide. Landing at Hilton Head requires full flaps, max braking, and a nonnegotiable touchdown in the first 1,000 feet of the runway.

Key West International is 5,706 feet and the standard 150 feet wide. Key West airport is the most southerly airport in the 49 US states excluding Hawaii.

Washington Reagan Runway is 5,204 feet. This one has a unique approach, extremely tight security restrictions, close to the capital and close to the Potomac River.
