










The Birth of Chapter 383

In February 1971, Don Gruett, Jim Parkin, and Bruce Morton took a road trip to Milwaukee to visit an old friend named Paul Poberezny. The gentlemen met at a bar above Timmerman airport for a few beers. That's where the seed was planted about EAA Chapter 383 in Manitowoc. Don't all great ideas start with a few barley pops? The idea grew and the chapter came to fruition in June with its charter number and designation.

The first meetings of the Chapter took place at the Rahr Malting Company hangar at Manitowoc Airport. Jim Parkin was a pilot for Rahr Malting. In the early days the Chapter hosted Manitowoc's first flying club called Nagirroc (which is wrong way CORRIGAN spelled backwards.) The Chapter also restored a 1946 Aeronca Champ.

In the 1990s, Manitowoc County sold the Rahr Hangar to the Chapter with the stipulation that it be relocated to its current home at 1805 Freedom Way. Charter members Gruett, Morton, and Parkin secured insulation from the decommissioned Manitowoc Ice building and repurposed the panels for the hangar ceiling.

Chapter 383 is here today because of four friends and bar conversation.

Don Gruett (1932-2019) An Air Force Veteran who was active in more aviation groups than you can shake a stick at.

Jim Parkin (1921-2011) A Civil Service government employee during WWII and flight test inspector. He learned to fly in 1940.

Paul Poberezny (1921-2013) Founder of EAA. He spend the greater part of his life promoting homebuilt aircraft.

Bruce Morton - alive and well in Manitowoc and still an active member.
