October 1, 1956 - Chapter Two of the Experimental Aircraft Association is chartered in Fort Wayne, Indiana.

October 7, 1909 - Glenn Curtiss becomes the first American to hold an FAI airplane certificate.

14 October 1947 - Capt. Charles "Chuck" Yeager becomes the first person to fly faster than sound. Yeager "breaks the sound barrier" in his Bell X-1 airplane, "Glamorous Glennis," named after his wife. He was able to reach 670-mph or Mach 1.015 at Muroc Dry Lake, California.
