

### Avaition History for the Month of September

September 3, 1908 - Orville Wright makes his first flight at Fort Meyer, Virginia, circling the field one-and-one-half times. During the next two weeks, he conducts a series of 14 long, high, and impressive flights, many of which set new records and are witnessed by government officials.

September 17, 1908 - The first fatality in a powered airplane occurs when Lieutenant Thomas Selfridge is killed while flying with Orville Wright at Fort Meyer, Virginia.

September 23, 1911 - Earl Ovington carries the first airmail in the United States in a Blériot monoplane from Nassau Boulevard Aerodome, Long Island to Mineola, Long Island.

September 27, 1913 - Katherine Stinson becomes the first woman in the United States to make an official airmail flight.

September 14, 1929 - Lt. James H. Doolittle makes the first blind, all-instrument flight.
