What are the 99's?

The Ninety-Nines are an international organization made up of female pilots. It was formed in 1929 with Amelia Earhart being a main founding member, and first president. The name came from the fact that when it was first formed there were 99 members. There were a total of 117 female pilots at the time, so 99 was a very good percentage! The mission of the organization is to inspire female pilots, done through group meetings (many of which are fly-ins), scholarships, and events throughout the year to inspire the next generation of pilots. My group the All-Ohio 99's likes to travel around the state for our meetings. We recently had a meeting at Burke Lakefront airport in Cleveland, where we had a former U-2 female pilot speaker and toured the International Women's Air and Space Museum.
