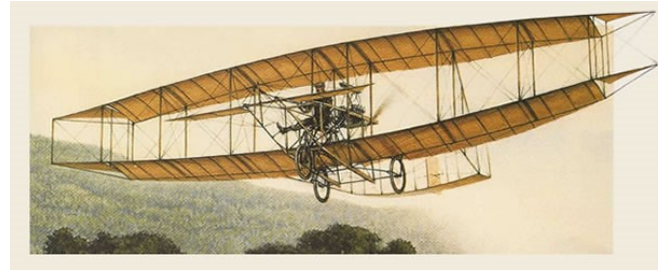

### **Next Meeting - Joint SSB/EAA 43 Picnic! - [Saturday, June 10, 2017](#)**

The Saturday, June 10 meeting of EAA Chapter 43 will a short road trip. As announced, we will be jointly meeting with the Soaring Society of Boulder at their outdoor facility. The time will be 5 pm (not 7!) and the location will be Boulder Municipal Airport, the NORTH or glider side of the field.

**TO GET THERE:** The north side of the field is only yards away by airplane, but a long way by road. So.... Set your automotive GPS to 5307 Independence Road, Boulder, CO 80301, or your airmotive one to KBDU. Directions for the digitally inhibited: Take US 36 to Foothills Parkway north, Exit at Valmont, eastbound. Quickly after exit turn left (north) on 47th St. Take 47th St. north less than a mile to CO 119, Diagonal Highway. Right (northeast) on Diagonal, then a quick right (east) on Independence Road. Park off the road in the widened parts of the driveway, two areas to the west end and one larger area a hundred yards east. Try to conserve parking space and there should be plenty.

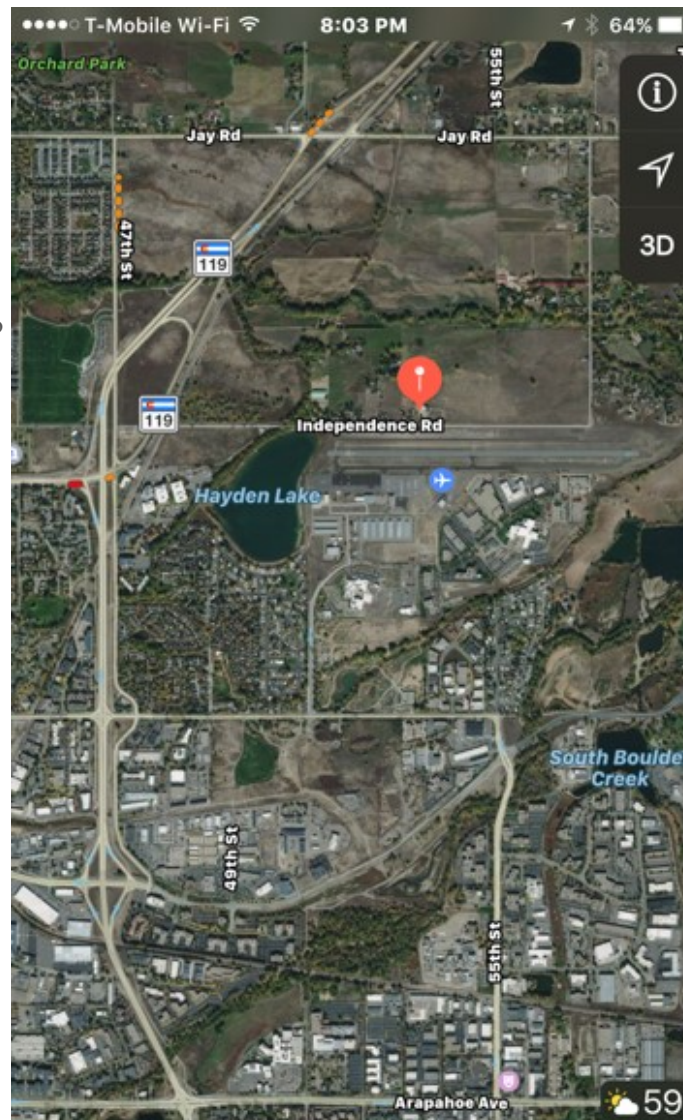
**PLEASE BRING:** yourself and someone special. Please also bring a couple of folding chairs as we may not have enough to seat everyone. Please also bring what you want to eat. (After just doing last month's picnic, its too uncertain to plan for an unknown number of folks.) SSB has a large grill so hamburgers, tube steaks, real steaks and all are fine - you will be able to cook them. Pitch-ins are not expected, but not declined either.

**WE WILL PROVIDE:** Stiff disposable plates and tableware. We will also have a tub of soft drinks. We will have some seating so we hope you won't need your chairs, but be safe.

**THE INFORMAL PROGRAM:** Each of the club presidents will say a few words. Tim Head, the Boulder Airport Manager will have a handout and talk about our special traffic patterns necessitated by the combination of sailplanes and powered airplanes, and some about the area's noise abatement procedures. Members of SSB will give us a tour of some of their ships, including a jet powered one.

**CAVEATS:** The grass areas and the skinny chip & seal runway are active aircraft areas. Gliders are really quiet and don't have the option to do go-arounds. Try not to venture south of the end of the chain link fence - it will make sense when you see it. If you plan to fly in, park your power plane on the SOUTH (terminal) side of the field where there are plenty of tie-downs and call someone and we will drive around to get you.

We hope that all will come! Some of our members are used to sailplanes, but for many, the degree to which they take lightness and smooth aerodynamic design is simply awesome. From the Editor:

This month's title picture is a nod to early aviation, the A.E.A. Aerodrome #3 "June Bug" piloted by Glenn Curtiss. A.E.A. stands for the Aerial Experiment Association, a Canadian-American aeronautical research group which was chartered in 1907 under the leadership of Dr. Alexander Graham Bell. The June Bug was the winner of the first aeronautical prize ever awarded in the United States, the 1908 Scientific American Cup. The event was filmed, making the June Bug the first airplane to perform in a movie. The June Bug featured a Curtiss engine and triangular wingtip ailerons designed by Bell, as well as tricycle landing gear which was also an A.E.A innovation (at least according to Wikipedia!) I will also note that the A.E.A. was funded by Mrs. Bell, who kicked in \$35,000 (worth a little under a MILLION of today's dollars!)

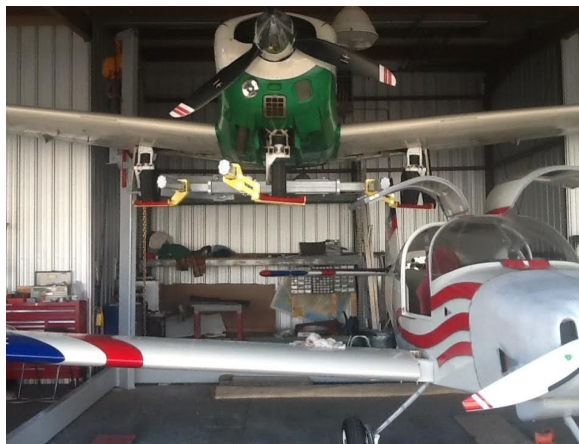

Ken thanked Eric and the Scholarship committee for their work.

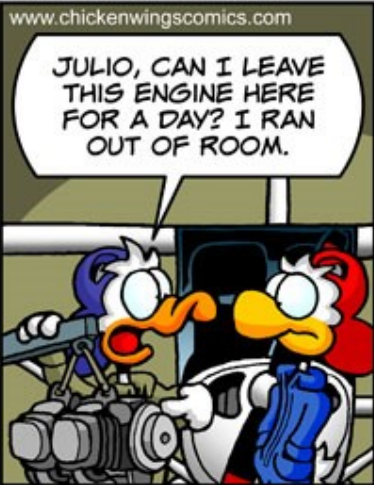
