David Biesemeier

1946 - 2013

DAVID I BIESEMEIER 1946-2013 PASSION FOR FLIGHT & FAMILY



The EAA Memorial Wall is filled with great aviators and experimenters who raised the bar by accomplishing great things in aviation. Joining this group is an exceptional individual who was not only a grand experimenter and aviator, but also a grand person.

David (Dave, as ne liked to be called) I. Biesemeier, as described by his wife, Lyne, of 45 years, was "a very helpful person, he would do anything to help anybody with their airplane." As such, he was the current EAA Chapter 43 President in Broomfield, Colorado. He also served as an EAA Technical Counselor, lending assistance to two local EAA Chapters, 43 and 515.

On the last day of his life, Dave had flown his experimental aircraft to the Rocky Mountain Metropolitan Airport to assist with a friend's aircraft. He had then attended the weekly aviator's lunch at the airport. On his flight back to his home airport in Loveland, Colorado, something tragically happened to Dave and his aircraft, a Smythe Sidewinder.

Soon after Dave's departure takeoff, an eyewitness indicated she saw a portion of his wing leave the aircraft, and the plane went down. Dave perished. One can only speculate what happened, since the National Transportation Safety Board has not yet issued a report at the time of this writing

Dave had been flying since 1976. Shortly after, he and his wife began building the Sidewinder in their garage from a set of plans. Four years later, Dave began flying around the country, from San Francisco, to Kitty Hawk, N.C. He regularly flew in the EAA AirVenture Cup Race to Cshkosh. He flew often, including many Saturdays with friends to breakfast, accruing over 1900 hours in his Sidewinder.

Aviation was not new to Dave. As a little boy growing up in Denver, Colorado, he had been interested in flying and had pursued rocketry. This continued into his adult life, as testfied by his son. Aaron fondly remembers his dad sharing his interest with him while in high school, building some pretty big rockets! The aviation passion stuck with Dave as he enlisted in the U. S. Air Force in 1967 and became a et engine and hel copter mechanic. He and his wife spent the next four years in Minot, North Dakota, serving his country. Upon discharge, he attended Colorado Aero Tech in Broomfield, Colorado, learning to be an A & P.

Dave retired in 2003 as a too and die maker after 29 years at Coors Brewing Company's container business in Golden, Colorado. His active retirement gave him time to continue his passion for flying, riding his bicycle "all over," and hiking with his wife in Rocky Mountain National Park. He, his wife, and daughter were also avid world travelers, having recently returned from Spain.


