

CHAPTER 43 MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES

August 13, 2016 Rocky Mountain Metro Airport

The meeting was called to order by Chapter President Ken Scott at 7:03 pm.

Introduction/Guests:

Dan Steveson, who is rebuilding a Zenith. He's a Colorado native and earned his AMP here before moving to Seattle where he helped work on FiFi (B29).

Joe Gilmore is a new member who owns a Grumman Cheetah and is considering a homebuilt project.

Anecdote: None this month.

Minutes:

Minutes from the July meeting were approved.

Treasurer Report:

Treasurer Myles Lee reported no change from last month - a balance of \$10,469 in the General Fund, \$3,687 in the Scholarship fund, and \$724 in the Young Aviators fund.

Scholarship:

The committee is in need of more members and a chairman. There are candidates in mind but volunteers are much appreciated.

Progress Reports:

Cliff Goldstein continues to make progress on his RV-14.

Trip Reports:

Cliff Hasenbalg flew his Glasair to Big Timber Montana for a dulcimer festival – 3 hours each way. Ricky flew with Bill Mitchell to Leadville the morning of the meeting in Ricky's RV-9. They topped out at 15,000' in altitude and 166 kts, earning Ricky his Certificate of Navigation.

Bill Mitchell drove Clair up to Gillette to inspect a 27 year build RV which flew for the first time the day of the meeting. Bill also recommended the Hatz article in the back of the August edition of Sport Aviation.

Safety Report:

During a Telluride landing, the pilot went from IFR to VFR and landed but collided with a snowplow. If he'd checked NOTAM, he'd have known the airport was closed.

Dave crashed landed his plane due to a loss of power. He was saved from a head injury by his dual shoulder harness, and has designed a canopy latch that works well in tipovers. Four or five cars and 40-50 bicyclists stopped almost immediately to help, and the accident was covered by the media from Longmont, Denver, Boulder, and Niwot.

Stan's friend in Byers was shot at with a shotgun (?!?) while flying – he recently settled out of court with the shooter.

Young Eagles:

Cliff Hasenbalg put out a call for pilots for the August event (36 kids) on August 20. EAA Youth Protection training was required to be completed in May for those working the events. Ground crew is also needed.

Young Aviators:

Scott Serani told us "We're done" following the Erie Air Fair the day of the meeting, where the Young Aviators had their last B25 event of the year. The B25 is stripped down in preparation for display in four Veteran's Day Parades. The Young Aviators have decided to focus a little more on field trips with less Projects for the next year.

Flight Advisors and Technical Counselors:

Bill Mitchell made a report on activities over the past month.

Old Business:

Bill Mitchell brought samples of both large and small embroidered chapter logo patches, available for \$18 and \$7 respectively, from Valerie Wait, who is Brent Haugen's sister.
