Fatal plane crash at Erie Airport, May 22, 2011


Christian R. Hansen (Ib) died in a fiery crash on Sunday morning in a maiden flight of a Cassutt 111M aerobatic racer. Lb and his son had built the plane for a Texas client who was following in a chase plane. After leaving Rwy 33 at Erie Airport, the plane reached about 300 feet and turned left and went down from there.

Lb, a native of Sweden, was a very experienced builder and pilot. He had over 40 years of flying, even in the Reno Air Races. He owned a machine shop in Arvada. The plane will be taken to a hanger in Greeley by the NTSB for the total investigation. He will be missed greatly by the aviation community. Our condolences to

Then there are those who love and do what they say they will. They are always prepared to stop whatever they are doing and lend a helping hand. They bring real sunshine into the lives of others.


