### President's Message

### A Tribute to Cleon J. Biter

As most of you know Cleon Biter passed away last December after a short battle with cancer. We are all sad about his passing and will miss him as a friend, fellow aviator, and Chapter 43 member. Cleon was an accomplished aviator with a soft spoken personality who was always more than willing and never too busy to help anyone who asked for advice about meteorology, flying, or other subjects he had a knowledge and interest in.

Cleon was a research meteorologist with the U.S. Navy Weather Research Facility in Virginia for five years and then worked for the National Center for Atmospheric Research in Boulder for 29 years, retiring in 1995. While at NCAR he received an Aviation Week and Space Technology Laurels Award and an NCAR Technology Advancement Award. He worked closely with the FAA developing aerial survey



routes and ATC procedures for NCAR aircraft conducting atmospheric research in the Denver area. After retiring from NCAR he continued his career as a consulting meteorologist from 1995-2009.

Cleon earned his private pilot's license at the age of 17 and continued flying until early November when he flew his last flight in his RANS S-19. He was a Master Certified Flight Instructor Emeritus, held numerous pilot ratings including land, sea, multiengine, instrument, private and commercial, and was a flight instructor for several years at Longmont's Vance Brand Airport as well as Mile High Gliding in Boulder. He was always interested in learning new

subjects and skills and loved to read, especially about science and aviation subjects. He enjoyed golf, target shooting, and was developing new interests in building robotics.


#### **Informal Awards**
