Pilot's Tip of the Month (Budd Davison, Plane & Pilot)

Pay attention to what your butt is telling you, keep the ball centered.
 The nose is talking too. Understand what it is showing you. Nose attitude controls speed.
 Understand what "plan ahead" actually means for each flight situation.
 If flying less than 35 hours a year, make each flight a learning experience.
 Take at least an hour of dual once a year.
 Land on strange airports just for practice.
 Take three hours of aerobatic instruction.
 Put yourself in "airplane mode" before leaving home.
 Challenge the nastiest crosswind you can find with an instructor.
 Be aware of holes in your knowledge.
 Make one out of five landings a short or soft field.
 Include a POH in the stack of bathroom literature.
