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Introducing Myles Lee, Chapter 43 Young Eagle Ground Coordinator with his RV-10



My name is Myles Lee and I have recently joined EAA chapter 43. In addition I have taken on the responsibility of coordinating Young Eagles along with Art for the chapter. My passion for aviation started as a young boy. When I was about 15, I road my bike 20 miles to an airfield to watch sailplanes.

Later I convinced my dad that we should take lessons together. Over the summer, I soloed in gliders. But then school started and flying stopped. My dad went on to get his privet license in power planes and bought a Cessna 172XP. When I went off to college, I started taking lessons in my dad's plane, soloed once again, but did not finish. Much later in life, I happened to become friends with a flight instructor. With his instruction, I passed my privet pilot check ride in October 1993, some 13 years after my first flight...

I quickly became frustrated with the rental market, and could not afford to buy an airplane. I had been looking at building for many years. I wanted a fast 4 place airplane as I have two young boys (Ryan and Kevyn) and a wife (Nila). When Van's came out with their RV-10, I knew that was to plane for me. With the support of my wife, who never said but I know she thought I was crazy, I started building in November 2003. With a young family, I built when I could with the attitude that someday I would run out of parts. After 6 ½ years and about 1800 hours of building, the parts became an RV-10. It flew for the first time this past July. Today, I have about 72 hours on the Hobbs and still have a great family to fly with. My job is working for a bank in their technology department as a software engineer, but aviation is what I dream about.

## Board Meeting Minutes January 31, 2010

Scott shared a review of EAA Leadership Academy

Goal for the chapter is to send two to the academy annually.

**2010 Chapter Objectives:** share passion of aviation, learn and attract new enthusiasts and have fun.

**2010 Chapter Goals:**

12 monthly gatherings, 3 \$1,500 scholarships, attract more GA enthusiasts (make ourselves more visible, wear name tags, chapter hats, shirts, etc), fly more Young Eagles (190-200 yearly), grow chapter membership (add 10 more yearly), Bill & Mary Mitchell to welcome visitors. Use a business card with your phone number on it.

**Budget Committee: Roxie Juul, Treasurer,** maintains checkbook, manage the budget, publish fund raising efforts (visible thermometer for meetings), and manage tax filings.

Establish 2010 budget. Income minus Expenses equals Fund Raising Requirements. (\$10,000)

Income: Member dues, SnowBusters, Young Eagles (donations), other fund raising efforts, donation jars, newsletter advertising.

Expenses: newsletters, SnowBusters, picnic, banquet, scholarships, Leadership Academy, Misc. exp. i.e. business cards, supplies, EAA annual dues.

**Membership Committee: John Reuterskiold (actually all members mission)**

Duties: maintain and publish membership roster, raise EAA 43 awareness to attract new members, annual enrolment (dues). National EAA is doing a 6 month free trail membership with full benefits.

We as a local chapter can offer same deal. We need a presence at all meetings and events, i.e. greeters, name tags, wear chapter logos (hats/shirts/patches). Possible food cart at events with chapter receiving some proceeds. Kyle to check on what will attract younger people to chapter meetings. EAA National on auto pilot for annual dues. Library subscriptions to Sport Aviation are \$23. Should this chapter have a media point person so the other committees can get press when they need it?

**Young Eagles Committee: Art and Myles**

Topics discussed: donation jar at events, food cart, safety officer at events, log books available which gives access to Sporty's Phase 1 Ground School and when they pass the course, they get a voucher for 1<sup>st</sup> flight paid by EAA National, involve parents, consider a hanger visit after event, on-line insurance registering available, use website to sign up. 8 events planned for 2010, 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of month. Publish limits for each event based on pilots and planes available and have rain checks printed up for overload or weather cancellation. Possible to use Jason's conference room for Ground School as well as a static display outside. Phillip's 66 will send a \$1 rebate for each gallon of aviation fuel used for flying Young Eagles using a Phillip's credit card. Possibly supply lunch after each YE event. Each pilot that flies 10 kids annually = 10 points @ \$5 and \$5 per kid thereafter is given to the chapter by EAA National. Greg Hall could takes pictures at events and put on website with password protection.

**Fund Raising Committee:**

Chapter Board handles. Events: Monopoly night, silent auctions, etc., calendar sales? Promote tax deductible contributions.

**Chapter Programs Committee (Kyle)**

Goal: Fill 9 slots of entertaining diverse programs with an alternative ready. Publish in newsletter and website as far in advance as possible. EAA National has Speaker's Bureau available.

**Scholarship Committee (Lynn, Steve & Gene)**

Publish 2010 objectives, establish and publish registration, prelim interviews and present finalists at chapter meetings. Final selection & awards & follow-up, and periodic reports to chapter.

**Newsletter Committee ( Bob Young)**

Goal: timely publication to membership, establishes a date (ideally first of month), upgrade / standardize presentation / regular columns. Format: featured person, board meeting minutes (when applicable) prior meeting minutes (use meeting agenda) next meeting agenda, upcoming events calendar, builder's tips, safety tips, advertiser's page, items for sale, services wanted, event posters, humor, and normal back page. Distribute events to local newspapers.

**Website Committee: ( Brian and Bruce)**

Goals: Whole new presence, public versus member's sites & calendar linked to National. Website needs to be the place to go for chapter information.

**Special Events Committee:**

Snow Busters: April 24 Tom Tomlin will do the cooking. Promote to local chapters, airports, newspapers and aviation websites. Erie Town Fair, Longmont Days, Boulder Aviation Days, Broomfield Days, picnic, banquet, chapter elections.

**Miscellaneous Admin Stuff:**

Business cards (Vistaprint.com FREE), donation jar with appropriate signing per event to take to fly-ins and meetings.

Pilots cannot exercise the privileges of their **PAPER** pilot certificates after **March 31, 2010**.

Certificates issued under 14 CFR Part 63 and 65 will expire March 31, 2013.

FAR 61.19(h) reads:

***Duration of pilot certificates.*** Except for a temporary certificate issued under §61.17 or a student pilot certificate issued under paragraph (b) of this section, the holder of a paper pilot certificate issued under this part **may not exercise** the privileges of that certificate after March 31, 2010.

There are two ways to replace an airmen certificate.

1. You can [request a replacement certificate online](#). This method requires that you register with Online Services.

2. Or you can mail us:

- an [Application for Replacement of Lost, Destroyed, or Paper Airman Certificate](#) (PDF) form

- or a signed, written request stating your:

- name
- date and place of birth
- social security number and/or certificate number
- the reason you need a replacement

- 1. You must include a check or money order for \$2 (U.S. funds), made payable to FAA, for each certificate you request.

#### **Important Information**

- Allow 4 to 6 weeks for mail processing and 7 to 10 days for online processing
- We can only issue one copy of each certificate
- We can't place the original date of issue on a replacement certificate
- We can't issue expired certificates. However, you can request an expired CFI letter at no charge.
- If your current address is listed as a Post Office Box (P.O. Box), General Delivery, Rural Route, or Star Route, please provide directions or a map for locating your residence.
