Last month's meeting was the International Young Eagles Rally that we held at Tri-County Airport. The only word to describe chapter 43's first attempt at a rally is Successful!



After we had started to set-up we found that chapter 660 had also scheduled a rally at Tri-County and the decision was made to simply partner up with them to make it one large event.

The biggest concern that the planners initially had was that we would end up with too many young people and not enough airplanes. As it turned out we could have used more people to take up for rides. Only four people had originally signed up to fly, but with the pilots from both 43 and 660 we had a total of 3 four place and 7 two place aircraft. That gave a total capacity of 16 seats for every sortie flown. We ended up flying a total of 26 new young eagles and a few older eagles. We could have easily flown 75 kids but for the first try the numbers worked out very nicely.

In addition to the flying aircraft on the ground there was a total of 6 display aircraft for the young people to look at. There was even one C-152 there for the purpose of providing a preflight walk-around, sit-in, and touch aircraft for everyone that wanted to participate. One of the chap 660 members had brought it over and that turned out to be a very worthwhile contribution.
