

NOVEMBER MEETING:

Many thanks to **Marv Wahl** for bringing in his sheet metal forming tools and doing a full demonstration on hammer forming aluminum.

Marv starts with a soft aluminum that will form relatively easily and begins hammering with a wood hammer into a walnut base stand that he has built. The basic shape starts to form after just a few strokes of the hammer and from there he refines the shape using various hammering devices. Most of the tools that he uses have been made or modified in his shop. In fact most of the tools are very basic and probably hang in most of our work areas.

The big difference between the average aircraft builder and Mary is the skill that he has developed over the years. He has probably hand formed almost every sheet metal part on an aircraft at some point in his career. He demonstrated just how fast and efficiently a basic round piece can be formed. The piece that he made could easily have been an engine cowl (for a small engine), part of a wheel pant, or a specialized piece for an experimental aircraft that could be done with standard parts.

If you are in need of a special component for an aluminum aircraft give Marv a call. If he doesn't know where you can find one he can certainly make one for you.
