

Air Academy Camperships & Academic Scholarships

The scholarship committee would like to give Chapter 43 members a heads up that the selection process for 2014 will be moving up. Instead of interviewing candidates in the January / February timeframe the committee will be interviewing in December of <u>this</u> year. The scholarship awards will be announced in January rather than at the picnic in April.

The reason behind this change is newly discovered scholarships that are available from EAA. Many of these scholarships have been around for many years and mostly undiscovered. Because very few EAA members know about them some aren't awarded every year because they simply aren't applied for. If we make our selections early in the year, before EAA's February deadline, it will allow the applicants that aren't awarded a Chapter 43 scholarship a second chance to apply for the opportunities at the national level.

Start to think about who you know that would be a good candidate for either an Air Academy Campership or an Academic Scholarship. The application deadline will be officially announced at the meeting in September but it will probably be in middle to later November. The application form is on the 43 website:
