

With a legitimate 7 weeks of time on the project, and some serious help from Mike Ackerman and Garth Daugherty, we are already at 500 man hours into the rebuild, with three major portions of the rebuild completed. I'm not sure I can keep the pace through the next 6 months, but if I (we) can, this rebuild make be completed in less than the expected two years (it IS a major undertaking!!). There will be more to come on that as we get closer. We haven't had one in June in a while, so looking forward to what we will see for interest.
