

alian Sausage, hot or mild, casings removed		
ed (medium or large, whatever you prefer)

eef broth (14 -15 oz.), roughly 4 cups.		
5 oz) Italian-style stewed tomatoes		
ots, sliced		
5 oz) great northern beans (or cannellini)		
cchini, cubed (I like to use 1 zuke and 1 yellow		
5 oz) spinach		
mall handfuls of tiny pasta (I use Acini di Pepe)

n Dutch Oven or stockpot, brown sausage, breaking it up.
