THE HOMEBUILDER'S CORNER

Challenger II Builder Report – October 2023

I am Building a Quad City Aircraft, Challenger II E-LSA 2007 Kit:

The Challenger II has a throttle control in the front and rear cockpits. These throttle levers are connected together with a short push rod. The factory supplied throttle levers are simple and cheap. They also have no practical way to set the friction while flying. The two carburetors each have rather strong internal springs that will return the throttle to the closed position, unless the pilot holds the lever at all times. The Challenger II really needs an adjustable throttle lock that the pilot can set while flying. Turns out, several other aircraft models have a similar need. You can find one on a SPAD XIII reproduction (AOPA Pilot/October 2023, page 77). A former Challenger II builder makes these Throttle Quadrants for Aircraft Spruce. (About \$50 to \$80, depending on the model.)

I purchased two of these throttle quadrants; front cockpit has the friction lock feature. The throttle quadrant installation, in progress, is shown in the pictures. The Bing carbs on the Rotax 503 do not have a pilot-adjustable mixture setting. So, I'm not sure what to do with the Mixture Lever on the front cockpit.




