


THE HOMEBUILDER'S CORNER

RV7 Project Status

The brief status update below summarizes my accomplishments over the last 6 months.

The first picture shows the basically finished canopy (tip up style). It mates with the not shown "rear window" with a seam at the roll bar. This was a lot of work.



The second picture shows the wheel pant and gear leg fairing fitted. These have to be carefully aligned in trail with the gear unloaded and fuse level as they would be in flight. Here it is level and pretty close to unloaded since the engine is not mounted at this point.



The third picture shows the fitting of the top cowling. Here the engine and flywheel must be in place as the first step is to establish the location of the aft spinner bulkhead. The propeller is simulated by using carefully measured PVC pipe spacers. In my case I plan on using a Hartzell Constant Speed prop. I am assured the spacers need to be 2 1/8" which is what I have used here. The goal is for a gap of 1/4" between the forward edge of the cowl and the aft edge of the spinner. Too tight makes the cowl hard to remove and install and too much looks excessive and may even adversely affect cooling airflow. Vans specifies hinges with removable pins for all cowl to firewall attachment as well as for mating the cowl halves. I am opting for skybolt fasteners only for this top section to the firewall. This curved region makes insertion of the hinge pins difficult. My experience with my RV-6 has been that the hinges for the other (straighter) sections is simple, effective and easily removed/installed for maintenance actions.
