



As you might have heard the **Martin Mars** Bomber made its Final Flight on Monday February 11, 2025. It landed on Lake Pleasant (because it is not amphibious). They have pulled it out of the water and parked it in the parking lot of the boat marina.

Tim and I took a drive to Lake Pleasant to see it and share this with you. It is a very impressive aircraft with a beautiful paint job. The plan is to disassemble the flying boat and transport it to the PIMA Air and Space Museum in Tucson, AZ for its final resting place. They told us they will take the

wings off (in two sections), the tail and elevators off (3 sections) and transport the fuselage as one piece. We had some unanswered questions like... How is it going to travel to PIMA when it's so tall? (Maybe over 30 feet?) Is there a route that doesn't involve going under bridges? What is the hot Arizona sun going to do to the beautiful paint job? Hmmm...

While we were standing there gawking, we met two guys from the CAF (who have worked on B-25's). They were there to offer their services, but the Mars crew



didn't even seem interested. The guys sure were interesting to talk to though.

At the rate they were moving today (very slowly), it's going to take a week (or more) to dismantle it. They also looked like they could have used more help. Maybe we'll go back in a week to see the progress they have/have not made.
