During <u>World War II</u>, Fairchild produced <u>PT-19/PT-23/PT-26 (Cornell)</u> and <u>AT-21</u> <u>Gunner</u> trainers, <u>C-82 Packet</u> transports and <u>drones</u>. The Fairchild AT-21 Gunner, a twin-engine trainer, was manufactured at a former rayon mill in <u>Burlington, North Carolina</u>. Also large numbers of the <u>Fairchild 24</u> (C-61/Argus) were produced for the military (principally as the Argus for the Royal Air Force), and continued production after the war for civilian market. Fairchild ranked 73rd among United States corporations in the value of World War II military production contracts.^[5] The **Fairchild Republic** A-10 Thunderbolt II is a single-seat, twin-turbofan, straight-wing, subsonic attack aircraft developed by **Fairchild Republic** for the ...
