NOW!

Many chapter members and many other men and women have been following the suggested FAA changes for the Light Sport pilot and aircraft. The plan is for these changes to come about in the fall of 2022. You may be aware, but here is a little update!

The rules are sometimes called MOSAIC (Modernization of Special Airworthiness Certification) It purposes wide changes that begins with a new name LPA (Light Personal Aircraft) LPA will represent a full range of aircraft the FAA will propose as suitable for Special Airworthiness Certificate. This choice will likely meet a larger definition of Light Sport Aircraft. They likely will allow operation by Light Sport Pilots. If a higher range is given it may require LPA pilots to obtain additional certification. The FAA suggest the plan is a rather large expansion of LPA. WEIGHT

There will be an increase in weight limits. It will likely be determined by a wing loading and horsepower index. Light Sport pilots will likely still be able to fly aircraft that meet the new definition of LSA. Most agree light sport pilots will be allowed to fly heavier aircraft then the current 1320#'s therefore a Cessna 150 or a Piper 140 may qualify.

MAINTENANCE

It's likely a "Light Sport Repairmen - Maintenance" might work. GYROPLANES.

It's likely fully built Gyroplanes may qualify for LPA use.

ELECTRIC PROPULISION.

Remains on the list of possible use in LSA.

LIGHT PERSONAL AIRCRAFT

These types of aircraft will take the lead in new regulations. This above information was taken from Dan Johnsons article in General Aviation Newspaper.
