Plane of the Month is Mike's Air Cam




Mike Weisenberger and his son Travis have been building this beauty in Florida flying back & forth for 4 year's WOW!

Mike tells you all about this beautiful Air Cam I already started begging for a ride! April 2017, went to Sun and Fun for first time with my Son, Travis We took demo rides at same time in 2 AirCams Most fun ever flying Decided to build an AirCam with help from a retired Lockwood Aircraft ,(kit manufacturer), employee Did build at Sebring, FL Travis and myself are co-owners/builders Took about 4 years or 3 additional grandchildren as my wife puts it Were times that I felt the build would never be completed After many trips to Florida, got our airworthiness inspection January, 2021 First flight March, 2021; 40hr fly off in Sebring, mid August. Back home in it's new home August 29th. 2, 100hp rotax 912uls engines Cruise about 80mph Takeoff about 200ft Landing about 200ft (experienced pilot) Empty weight about 1,100lbs Gross weight about 1600lbs Takeoff and land about 45mph Has flaps Aluminum fuselage Traditional aircraft fabric control surfaces Wings - very durable fabric envelope, no shrinking required, stretched only Originally designed as a camera platform for National Geographic
